BUK Staff Model Primary School Wins Jets Quiz Competition

The Bayero University Staff Model Primary School won the first round of Junior Engineers, Technicians and Scientists Test Quiz Competition popularly known as JETS on Tuesday, 19th February, 2019.

BUK Model Primary School defeated Prison Service Staff Primary School to qualify for the next round. There were a total of 40 questions of the quiz which cut across four major subjects of English, Mathematics, Basic Science and Computer Science. The pupils of BUK Staff Model School were

successfully able to answer all of their 40 questions correctly, which enabled them to be come the winner.

The Competition which took place at Mahmud Tukur Theatre Old Campus was organized among primary schools in Gwale L.E.A. The Competition had three rounds; the remaining second and third round will be held soon and the winner will represent Gwale Local Government at the State level, which will comprise of the whole 44 local governments of Kano state.

ASUU-BUK/ASUU National Indigent Scholarship Award

Guidelines for Study Fellowship and Self - Sponsorship for Non-Teaching Staff

The following guidelines shall be observed in considering the application for nomination of Non-Teaching staff for training programmes:

A) FULLTIME STUDY FELLOWSHIP

Staff who wishes to pursue full time study fellowship must satisfy the *undermentioned* criteria in each of the programmes:-

- i. The candidate being *presented* shall be a confirmed staff.
- ii. The proposed training should be relevant to the line of duty for which the staff member is employed.
- iii. The Department should *endorse* the release of the staff for the period of the training.
- iv. The staff must have discharged the bond he/she signed, *where applicable*
- v. A staff *on study fellowship* who fails to successfully complete a sponsored programme due to reasons attributable to him *except on health* grounds shall not be sponsored for the same but higher programme.
- vi. Not more than *one-fifth* of staff members should be released for a Degree/Diploma programme in the same Department in a period of 4 years for a Degree or a period of 2 years for a Diploma programme, as the case may be

All staff granted study fellowship shall sign a bond to serve the university for a period equal to the one spent on the study.

B. PART-TIME STUDY FELLOWSHIP

Staff who wishes to pursue part time study fellowship must satisfy the under-mentioned criteria.

- i. The candidate being *presented* shall be a confirmed staff .
- ii. The Department should *endorse* the release of the staff for the period of the training.
- iii. The staff must have discharged the bond he/she signed, *where applicable*
- iv. Not more than *one -fifth* of staff members should be released for relevant Professional Masters, Degree and Diploma programmes in the same Department; in a period of 4 or 3 years for a Degree 2 years for a Diploma and one year for a Professional Masters programme, as the case may be

- v. Staff could be allowed to undergo part time programme on part- sponsorship at the National Open University (NOUN) or any other recognized institutions if the programme is relevant to his/her duties.
- vi. Other short-term courses/training relevant to staff area of specialization could also be considered.

C) SELF-SPONSORSHIP

- i. A member of staff who failed to successfully complete a programme sponsored by the University *may be* allowed to undertake *the same* or another programme on self-sponsorship.
- ii. A candidate applying for self-sponsorship needs not be confirmed. Newly employed staff should serve a one - year acclimatization period.
- iii. Self-sponsorship could be allowed even where the programme of study is outside the line of duty of the staff provided it is offered in a recognized Institution and will not interfere with his duties.
- iv. Self-sponsorship could also be allowed to a member of staff who enjoyed an approved fellowship if the staff has not fulfilled the conditions in the bond for the fellowship.
- v. Not more than *one fifth* a staff members should be released for a Degree programme in the same Department in a period of 4 years or a period of 2 years for a Diploma programme.
- vi. *All part – time* applications shall be *fully recommended* by the Head of Department.
- vii. Self-Sponsorship does not require signing a bond.
- viii. Staff that were allowed to undertake a course on self sponsorship should wait for *at least a period of one year* before applying for another programme.

D) SCHEDULE OF BOOK ALLOWANCES FOR STAFF ON STUDY FELLOWSHIP

NB: i. Staff that acquired additional qualification before joining the service of the University shall be accepted if the certificate is relevant to their official duties, so as to prevent sponsoring him/her for the same certificate.

- ii. The University shall not sponsor any form of programme in any private institutions.
- iii. Only part – time programmes shall be considered for self-sponsorship.

GUIDELINES FOR WORKSHOP, SEMINAR AND CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE FOR NON-TEACHING STAFF

The following guidelines shall be observed in considering the applications for nomination of Non-Teaching Staff for sponsorship to attend Workshop, Seminar, and Conference:

1. The candidate being nominated shall be a confirmed staff *except in exceptional circumstances, where specialized training is required.*
2. *All Applications for Workshop/Seminar and Conference shall be endorsed by the applicants H.O.D's.*
3. The candidate should be invited by the training organization *or should attach a copy of the flier from the training organization or nominated by the Head of Department*
4. The candidate should be a registered member of the training organization *for all Professional Workshop, Seminar and Conference*
5. The training Workshop/Conference should be in line with the candidate's schedule of duty.
6. The candidate will only be sponsored for National Conference, Seminar or Workshop once every year *and for International Conference every other year*
7. Staff on study fellowship are not entitled for sponsorship to any National Conference or Workshop except those on self-sponsorship.
8. Only a maximum of two staff members from the same department or unit could be sponsored to attend same National Workshop or Conference.
9. A candidate sponsored for workshop or conference should submit a report on the training he attended within two weeks of his return. Failure to submit the report of the Workshop/Conference a candidate attended will be sanctioned.
10. A candidate could be allowed to attend Conference/Workshop on self sponsorship.
