Mambayya House Organizes Symposium for Combating Corruption through Religious Leaders

The Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, (Mambayya House), has organized an interfaith sensitization workshop for religious leaders in the North-Central Geo-Political Zone in an effort to combat corruption from the Islamic and Christian perspectives.

The annual Symposium with the theme: Towards Consolidating the Efforts of Religious Leaders in Combating Corruption in Nigeria is a three-year project (2018-2020) supported by the Catherine T. McArthur Foundation aimed at fighting corruption and cultivating the culture of integrity and accountability in Nigeria by capitalising on the religious institutions.

The event held on Wednesday, 19th August, 2020 at Sa'adu Zungur Auditorium Complex, Mambayya House with brainstorming sessions from various scholars.

In his opening remarks, the Director of Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, (Mambayya House), Professor Ismaila Mohammed Zango, who was represented by the Deputy Director (Training), Dr. Samaila Suleiman, said the idea behind the project was informed by the fact that despite the various anti-corruption programs and strategies by governments, the problem of corruption is rather waxing stronger by all indices.

He added that, it was against the background of this quagmire that the project was designed with a view to amplifying voices and collective action against corruption using interfaith platforms in Nigeria.

The Chairman of the Occasion, Malam Ibrahim Muazzam, in his remarks, challenged participants to emulate the good habits of our past leaders sighting examples from the lifestyle of late Malam Aminu Kano which he said taught virtues of honesty, determination, simplicity, courage, integrity and generosity.

In their separate presentations, the Director, Centre for

Economic, Social and Population Research (CESPOR) BUK, Dr. Nu'uman Habib, dwelt on the efforts made by Nigeria to tame corruption, the milestones recorded in that direction, the challenges being encountered in that quest and the possible remedies to the challenges.

While Professor Salisu Shehu, Deputy Secretary General of the Nigerian Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs and his Christian counterpart, Mr. Henry Ijoman, Manager Training, Lux Terra Leadership Foundation had discussed on what Islamic and Christian texts and philosophy revealed about how religious leaders should re-orient followers on the need to fight against corruption.

Covid 19: BUK Centre Gets NCDC Commendation as One of Top 4 in Nigeria

The National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) has commended Bayero University's Centre for testing samples of COVID-19, saying that it was among the top four of sixty two centres in Nigeria with most tests since the beginning of the pandemic.

This was disclosed by the outgoing Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, when the Governor of Kano, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje inspected the facilities on Saturday, 15th August, 2020. He told the governor that the NCDC had published in its weekly report number 32 of Key Performance Indicator (KPI) Lab network on 14th August, 2020.

The Centre according to the Vice Chancellor had tested 17, 219 samples from Kano, Jigawa, Gombe and Katsina States and if merged with the 10, 612 by the Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, the two centres combined tested 27,831 samples.

Professor Bello explained that Bayero University took pro-active steps by purchasing equipment and reagents worth N50m using its internally generated revenue as well as mobilized its resources and manpower from other related centres such as Centre for Biotechnology Research.

He added that the University received support from other sources such as ultra-modern GeneExpert Machine from AA Rano Foundation and \$63,000 from USAID. These would boost the capacity of our centre," said the outgoing VC.

He commended the Governor of Kano State for supporting the Centre and healthcare activities in Kano State, commending him for establishing Ganduje

Health Centre which would be used by the University's medical students for offering services to the rural communities.

"The Cancer Treatment Centre at Muhammadu Sunusi Hospital Giginyu is the first of its kind in Nigeria. This has shown how committed your administration is in terms of providing better healthcare system in the state" Prof Bello added.

On his part, Governor Abdullahi Umar Ganduje applauded the commitments and resilience of Bayero University in terms of its doggedness in the fight against COVID-19, noting that it was the university with the best approach in the country, using its IGR in this regard.

The Governor noted that Kano State was earlier on hit with the dearth of COVID-19 test centres, but with BUK's 540 testing capacity, Dangote's mobile centre, AKTH's and two others, the testing capacity was up scaled in the state.

"This effort has placed Kano as number 8th in terms of positivity index with 0.1-0.9%, noting that the state government would look into the possibility of providing more support to BUK Centre in order to eradicate the dreaded virus.

The Director, Centre for Infectious Diseases Research, Professor Isa Abubakar expressed appreciation to the Governor of Kano State for giving maximum support to the Taskforce headed by the Deputy Governor, Nasiru Gawuna and for approving allowances to the healthcare personnel.

Governor Ganduje Commissions BUK's International Conference Centre

corporate social responsibility between the University and the people of Kano State.

Governor Ganduje stated that the centre would create a symbiotic relationship and serve the international, national and local communities. He commended Senator Bello Hayatu Gwarzo, who played a formidable role facilitating ensuring the construction of the edifice.

The outgoing Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the Centre would house an ultra-modern auditorium with the capacity of 1200 people at a time; 6 syndicate rooms that can accommodate 100 people at a time; 500 capacity lounge and 38 charlets among others.

“This building was made possible by the intervention of Senator Bello Hayatu Gwarzo when he made sure that it was captured in the budget by the federal government while he was in the Senate,” said the Vice Chancellor.

He explained that while the University was trying to complete the project, it sought the approval of the TETFund to use normal intervention which was approved thereby commending the TETFund for the gesture.

According to him, BUK has been working with all the governments of Kano State and Governor Ganduje took the relationship to the highest level, noting that the involvement of staff in the activities of the state was unprecedented. He reiterated that the University would continue to work closely with the state government.

The Governor was later taken round the facility and also the Senate Chamber, which he jokingly said he thought he was in Dubai.

No Link Between 5G Network & Corona Virus ...Expert

An expert in telecommunication Engineering, from Bayero University, Kano, Dr. Lawal Muhammad Bello, has insisted that the 5G network has no connection whatsoever, with the Corona-Virus and or any ailment.

Dr. Lawal Bello, who teaches at the Department of Electrical Engineering, explained that the 5G network is no more than the upgraded version of telecommunication, pointing out that the insinuation of linking the network with any ailment or disease is the figment of the imagination of mischief makers.

He spoke in a special radio Freedom programme "Duniyar Kimiyya" monitored in Kano at the weekend, that the world is gradually turning to digitization thereby moving away from the analogue. He noted that with the new trend, the world would be more secure and advance in communications.

Dr. Bello while tracing the history of telecommunication right from the smoke ages to date disclosed that the 5G network is just an upgrade of the human communications thereby enhancing security and civilization.

"For anyone to tell you that 5G or any network has ulterior motive on human health, is showing his ignorance of the development stages in the world," said, Dr. Lawal Bello, arguing that the world has developed beyond our narrow imaginations.

According to him, at the development stages, the world introduced many forms of communication which included the use of smoke, drums, horse and pigeon and later telephony, telegram, telephone, telex as well as fax machines among others.

He disclosed that it was in the 15th century that an Egyptian King at that time introduced the use of Pigeon to send messages, and later in the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries new communications including radio, television, telephony and other means were introduced, saying that in the early 19th century the 1G communication was introduced after which it was upgraded to 2G and later 3, 4 and now 5G.

Dr. Bello noted that when fully operational, the 5G network would provide maximum security and improved communication mechanism. “Through the application of the instrumentality of 5G, the world may be safer, as one can detect what is happening in one’s home, office or business premises using technology and can detect any fault without physically being there.”

On this note, “I can comfortably tell you that 5G is a blessing to us in disguise and has no negative effect on the health of the people whatsoever. You should also note the radiation in the electromagnetic from the telecommunication antenna is none iodized and therefore, has no threat to human health,” he added.

Bayero University Senate has approved that all qualified candidates who applied for admission into the University in the 2020 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination conducted by Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB) should be screened through an aptitude test.

Note that supplying false information will result in disqualification. You are allowed to supply a maximum of two different 'O' Level examination results. Candidates without 'O' Level results can choose the Awaiting Result (AR) option against the subjects they sat for or intend to sit for. The results must be provided before the end of the admission exercise.
