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How to Revamp Education in Nigeria ...DG, NTI

he Director General of the National Teachers Institute (NTI), Professor Garba Dahuwa Azare, has said that one of the surest ways of revamping the ailing education sector would be allowing real educationists to manage the sector at all levels.

Speaking in a chat with the Bayero University, Kano's media team in his office in Kaduna on Thursday, 20th February, 2020, he lamented at what he described as the lackadaisical handling of education sector by managers who are not educationists. "The right people should be appointed to manage the education sector, if we are to succeed in our quest towards the revitalization of education."

"Education in general has collapsed in this country. In my view, I think, a number of factors were responsible for this ugly development and one of them is putting responsibilities of managing the sector in the hands of non-educationists and another factor is attributed to lack of training and capacity building among the teachers. "Therefore, as a panacea to this gory situation, the government must take teacher training with utmost priority," he said.

Professor Garba Azare, while appreciating the commitment of the Federal Government in terms of teacher training and retraining, however, said the state and local governments had not been given the system the right attention, particularly in the aspect of capacity development.

According to him, capacity building, continuing professional development training and the acquisition of knowledge on Information and Technology are very vital in the quest for reviving the comatose education sector in the country.

The NTI Boss blamed the teachers as the architects of the problem in the education sector. "Teachers are the problem of education in Nigeria. Teachers are teaching, but learning is not taking place and this is due to lack of capacity building, discipline and zero commitment on the part of some of the stakeholders".

He advised that state government and local governments should have to vigorously pursue the issue of teacher training. He lamented that many states await the Federal Government to shoulder and bankroll the training expenses of their teachers.

Professor Azare also decried the existing lacuna between the nation's universities and regulatory bodies. He said allowing the situation to continue this way might not augur well for the development of education sector. "It is regrettable to observe that there is lack of synergy between the Universities and the regulatory bodies and this has adversely affected the growth of the sector," he further revealed.



On his achievements at NTI since assumption to office in 2016, the NTI chief executive disclosed that the agency was gradually regaining back its lost glory as a result of the concerted efforts put in place by his administration.

He said currently all the degree programmes offered by the Institute had secured full accreditation from the National Universities Commission (NUC) while all the backlog of certificates from University of Ibadan, Usmanu Danfodio University, Sokoto, University of Maiduguri and the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN) had all been secured.

Lack of Foresight Bane of Quality Education in Nigeria — Prof. Dahuwa Azare

Lack of long term planning and poor implementation have been responsible for the collapse of the education sector in Nigeria and are, occasioned by the decline in quality in teaching and research.

The Director General, National Teachers' Institute (NTI), Professor Garba Dahuwa Azare, said this on Thursday, 20th February, 2020 at an interactive interview with members of Bayero University, Kano's Media Team in his office in Kaduna.

Professor Azare explained that policy makers in education did not critically design their programmes based on the strength, weakness and threat that might derail their successes but went on to make plans that addressed the needs of that time.

The DG explained that other factors that

adversely affected the education sector were poor funding, over-population and inadequate trained teachers and insufficient facilities in public schools, noting that if drastic measures were not properly taken, the system would continue to degenerate.

However, the DG NTI said as a way of getting out of the woods concerning the quality of education in Nigeria, teachers must be trained and retrained and the right data should be used for effective planning with future projections in terms of population and technological advancement.

Professor Garba Azare, who spoke on a wide range of issues, also said his desire before the expiration of his tenure was to turn the NTI into a University of Education.
