



Mambayya House Leads Anti-Corruption Crusade in Northern Nigeria

...Trains Over 500 CSOs in 3 Years

Mambayya House, the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies has spearheaded a project aimed at mobilizing and educating citizens to actively engage in activities that will strengthen social accountability and improve service delivery in the 19 Northern States and the country at large.

This was made public on Wednesday, March 16, 2022 during the 1st Bi-annual Press Conference of the Centre on a 3-year Anti-Corruption Project entitled “Promoting Accountability and Anti-Corruption through Behavior Change Approaches, 2021-2024” which was funded by John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation.

In the press briefing led by the Director, Prof. Ismaila Mohammed Zango said, Mambayya House as a grantee has been working with four sub-grantees namely: the Interfaith Network Against Corruption (INAC), Interfaith Mediation Centre (IMC), Inter-religious Coalition Against Corruption in Nigeria (ICACN) and the University of Nigeria Nsukka Muslim Community (UNNMC) with the goal of establishing a robust, self-sustaining accountability

ecosystem in Nigeria that could overtime embolden citizens to prevent, reject and prosecute corruption and improve transparency and accountability among public officials.

While appraising the fight against corruption in Nigeria, Prof. Zango described it as herculean task that demands all hands to be on deck to attain success. He said, to achieve that, the project trained over 500 organizations across the 36 states which targeted Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Faith-Based Organizations (FBOs), Community-Based Organizations (CBOs), the media, students' associations and government agencies as the “voice actors” of behavioral change for citizens to be able to recognize, speak out, resist and report any corrupt behavior.

In his welcome address, the Programme Coordinator, Prof. Moses T. Aluaigba said the initial project was 3 year from 2018-2020 but after successful completion, Mambayya House was re-granted to implement the second phase for another 3 years from 2021 to 2024.

Bayero University, Kano Dress Code Brochure

In line with the university's role of training students in both character and learning, all students should dress decently in accordance/compliance with the Bayero University, Kano dress code. Accordingly, acceptable and decent dress is any type of dress worn by a student, that covers the body from top of the shoulders to midway between the knee and the ankle, and it must not be tight fitting or transparent.

Specifically, the dress code forbids indecent dressing such as:

1. Short, bare back and clinging dress
2. Shorts and three quarter trousers (except for sporting purpose)
3. Tattered jeans and those with holes
4. Transparent dresses
5. Tight fitting dresses e.g. jeans and skirts that reveal body curves; this is also applicable to locally sewn dresses such as skirts and blouses
6. Wearing only under clothing such as singlet in public places
7. Wearing "Swagger" and/or Sagging trousers
8. Dresses, such as skirts, which have long slits that reveal sensitive body parts
9. Dresses and vests with obscene and indecent inscriptions

and/or pictures

10. Dress without buttons, or not properly buttoned, revealing bare chest
11. Wearing jackboots, bathroom slippers and any other shoes with indecent inscription
12. Sunglasses in lecture rooms and theaters except on medical grounds
13. Plaiting/weaving, perming of hair and use of earrings and chain and bracelets by male students
14. Use of military and para-military camouflage by students on campus
15. Any other dressing that contravenes, decency, decorum and good taste of the community

NOTE:

Students should note that, these prohibitions apply everywhere on the campuses. In addition, students are bound by the specific dress code of their Faculties, Departments or Professional callings.

Offenders will be sanctioned as appropriate.
