40 Years after the Maiden Conference: BUK Holds 2nd International Conference on Kanuri Language

In its determination to lead in all aspect of academic sphere, tradition and culture are fundamental aspects of human history that can never be ignored. The Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages, Translation and Folklore (CRNLTF) organized the 2nd international conference on Kanuri Language, Literature and Culture, on the 11th and 12th October, 2023. This year's conference bridged the longest gap between the 1st conference on Kanuri Language and Culture that was held on December 1979 at Bayero University, Kano.

This was highlighted in the welcome address delivered by the Director Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages, Translation and Folklore, BUK, Professor Yakubu Magaji Azare, "it is a great pleasure to close the gap of +40 Years since the maiden conference was held at Bayero University in the year 1979. The main purpose of this Conference is to promote Nigerian Languages notably Hausa, Fulfulde and Kanuri".

Furthermore, the Director explained the effort and contribution of the centre towards simplifying learning by translating 8 Science Books that were published in Hausa language and he also hoped to have some in Kanuri Language as well. The director welcomed every one for coming, especially the Shehu of Borno for his eminent presence in the conference.

In his address, the Chief host, the Vice Chancellor, Bayero University, Kano, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas FMAN, who was represented by DVC Academics, Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, welcomed everyone to the occasion.

The Vice Chancellor expressed his delight as he called it a great day: Borno Day, "We gather here to witness the 2nd International Conference on Kanuri Language, Literature and Culture."

In his key note address, His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Borno State, Professor Babagana Umara Zulum, who was represented by the Chairman Civil Service Commission, Borno State, Dr. Maina Mari Gubyo mni, said "We in Borno are sincerely appreciative for this second time conference on the Kanuri Language, coming 42 years after the maiden conference, which resulted in the production and publication of several works including a Kanuri-English Dictionary and Standard Kanuri Orthography," he said.

In his remark, the Shehu of Borno, Alh (Dr) Abubakar Ibn Umar Garbai El Kanemi CFR, expressed his delight for the occasion at Bayero University which is his first visit to the University.

He discussed on the journey the Kanuri people have faced over the last 4 decades since the 1st International conference. The Kanuri empire has stood for over 1500 years and so many things have happened, like the insurgency of Boko Haram but was never defeated.

He called on the general public to keep up with prayer as it is fundamental aspect of peaceful coexistence and make use of useful information.

The Chairman of the Occasion, Alhaji Muhammad Bulama OON, explained that a lot has taken place since the last 40 years in the north east region particularly in Borno, notably among these events is the Boko Haram crisis that has

ravaged the region for over 10 years. He also said the exploration of oil in the region has not come as a surprise especially with the discovery of oil in neighboring countries close to their borders.

The conference was graced with the presence of noble guests both within and outside Nigeria, delegations from both Chad and Cameroun were also present at the conference.

Among the lead paper presenters were; Professor Muhammad Waziri, Professor Shettima Umar Bulakarima and Professor Norbert Cyffer, the Shettima Luggama Kanurube, who ventured into African Studies especially Kanuri in the year 1968.

Experts Advocate Phonemic Awareness, Early Grade Reading for Academic Achievement

Ahead of its 4th National Conference on Children's Books and the Teaching of Early Grade Reading, the Nigeria Centre for Reading Research Development (NCRRD) organized a Pre-conference Workshop on the Components of Reading on Tuesday, 3rd October, 2023 at the Training room of the Centre.

At the workshop, scholars and researchers collectively advocated the urgent need to give emphasis to developing children's phonemic awareness, vocabulary development and early reading as essential skills for the academic success of any child.

Presenting at the workshop, Professor Amina Adamu, a researcher at the Centre, stressed that teaching students reading at early grade helps develop other essential skills which is vital in the academic success of a child. She said that in order to foster phonemic awareness, teachers should select books that play with words and also during reading play language games.

On her part, Amina Ibrahim Abubakar of USAID Learn to Read Project, shed light on the role of phonics for effective reading instructions as it is one of the foundational skills of reading. She added that phonemic instructions are significant in preventing reading difficulties for at-risk pupils.

While making his presentation, Aliyu Shuaibu from USAID Learn to Read Project, emphasized on the strategies teachers need to use to teach children vocabulary

right from early grade level which included concept mapping, word sorting among others. He noted that these skills are important in teaching many languages as language is powerful in any academic endeavor.

Earlier speaking, the Director of the Centre, Professor Talatu Musa Garba pointed out that the conference was

aimed at giving teachers orientation and equipping them with all the necessary skills needed on early grade reading as it is crucial for children's academic success.

While wishing the entire conference participants a fruitful discussion, she encouraged them to use the workshop to form new alliances and collaborations among themselves.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Presentation Formats

Abstracts are submitted for oral presentation only.

Guidelines for the submission

- a. Abstracts must be original and have not been previously accepted/published in a peer-reviewed journal or presented at previous conference(s).
- b. Submissions should be relevant to population health or policy
- c. All abstracts must be submitted electronically via the approved College Foundation Day email (bukcollegeoralfoundation2023@gmail.com).
- d. All submissions shall indicate all authors and the presenter.
- e. Notification of the successful submission of the abstract will be sent by email.
- f. All submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the scientific sub-committee and an Acceptance Notification will be sent to the presenting author by email not later than 31st October, 2023 which will also include the presentation guidelines.

1. Abstract Format

Abstracts will be reproduced in the Book of Abstracts exactly in the form they are submitted and accepted. Authors are therefore kindly requested to adhere to the following guidelines. Failure to do so may result in the rejection of the abstract.

- a. Language: All submissions and presentations should be in English.
- b. Title: This should be as brief as possible and typed in sentence case (all letters in lowercase except the first letter of the first word of the title) e.g. Percutaneous selective renal artery embolization in the management of advanced renal cell carcinoma: early experience in Kano, Nigeria (no full stop/period after the title).
- c. Authors: The presenting author should be listed first and up to five more authors can be included for case and technical reports only. The author's surname should be by initials. There is no limit to the number of authors for full-length research papers.
- d. The affiliation details of all authors (department, institution/hospital, city/town, state (if relevant), and country should be included with the submission.

2. Abbreviations

- a. Use standard abbreviations.
- b. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parentheses after the first time the full word appears.
- c. Use numerals to indicate numbers, except when beginning sentences.

3. Abstract Character Limit

- a. Abstract Body word Limit: 250, excluding the title, names of authors/coauthors, authors' affiliations, spacing, and disclosures.
- b. Abstracts exceeding the character limit will be considered "incomplete".
- c. Abstracts marked "incomplete" at the close of the submission deadline will be ineligible for consideration.

4. Authorship Criteria

- a. Substantial contributions to study conception and design.
- b. Substantial contributions to the acquisition of data.
- c. Substantial contributions to the analysis and interpretation of data.
- d. Drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content.
- e. Final approval of the version of the article to be published.
- f. Other critical study activities (need to be specified).
- g. There is no limit on the number of authors that may be included in the author block (refer to 2c above).

5. Content

- a. Do not use new technical words, laboratory slang, words not defined in dictionaries, or abbreviations or terminology not consistent with internationally accepted guidelines.
- b. Define any abbreviations the first time they are used.
- c. Refer to the unified list of acronyms for recommendations on acceptable terms for scientific communication.
 - a. The abstract should be structured with section headings as follows:
 - I. **Background:** State clearly the background of the study including what is already known about the research question.
 - II. **Objective:** State the purpose.
 - III. **Methods:** State the study design, the methods, materials, and analytical procedure used, as well as the statistical analyses conducted.
 - IV. **Results:** Summarize the results in sufficient detail to support the conclusion.
 - V. **Conclusion:** State the major conclusion(s) reached

6. Disclosure Policy

- a. This scientific committee will ensure balance, independence, objectivity, and scientific rigor in all its educational activities.
- b. The scientific subcommittee of the college foundation day requires that individuals (presenters/speakers, moderators, reviewers, authors and planners, and their spouses/partners) disclose to the scientific sub-committee all issues of conflicts of interest.

7. Multiple Submissions of the Same Study

- a. The same study should not be submitted as multiple abstracts.
- b. Therefore, if the abstracts in question are not different enough to be considered separate studies (specifically, if they address the same research question or present the same results), they may all be rejected.

8. Presentation Formats

- a. Abstracts are considered for oral presentation only.
- b. As English is the designated language for the meeting, the presenting author is required to speak English when presenting.

9. Review Process

- a. Submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee and evaluated in terms of their appropriateness and their overall quality.
- b. Abstracts will be assessed on their acceptability and eligibility for presentation constructively and educationally.
