CDA Conducts 4th International Conference on Drylands

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) has conducted the 4th International Conference on Drylands with the theme: *Ecosystem Restoration and Natural Resource Management: Exploring Opportunities for Food Security in the Drylands* from 11th to 14th September, 2023.

The conference, which was organized in collaboration with the International Crops Research Institute for the semi-arid Tropics (ICRISAT), the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) and the International Centre for Maize and Wheat Improvement (CIMMYT), represented a convergence of minds, hopes, dreams and aspirations for a better and more sustainable future in the world's dryland environments.

Declaring the conference open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas described ecosystem restoration as pivotal in shaping research, policies and programs to achieve food security in Africa.

Represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Management

Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, the Vice-Chancellor said the CDA was committed to creating natural environment that empowers the peasants of dryland to achieve food security.

“It underscores the importance of fostering collaboration and dialogue among scholars, practitioners and policy makers to address the unique challenges of Africa,” he said.

In his welcome address, the Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin said the theme of the conference aligns with the current United Nation's Decade for Ecosystem Restoration, which underscores the need to restore the planet's fragile ecosystems and food security challenges.

The Director noted that “through rigorous training, cutting-edge research and meaningful outreach, we have strived to enhance the adaptability of these regions to the ever-changing environmental dynamics. He said the 4th

international conference is more interesting and enriching experience because it went concurrently with the Food for West Africa network conference.

“In this year's conference, we proudly introduce an existing collaboration with the Food for West Africa Network (Food4WA), an alliance of Africa Centres of Excellence in agriculture funded by the World Bank and AFD. He explained that Food4WA's mission to maximize the collective capabilities of ACEs in West and Central Africa resonates with our commitment to addressing development challenges and enhancing food security through research, training and community engagement.”

The conference he said intended to address multitude of challenges confronting West Africa and Central Africa relating to low agricultural productivity, climate change and high population pressure through knowledge sharing platforms.

Earlier speaking, the Chairman of the Local Organizing Committee, Professor Aliyu Salisu Barau, emphasized the need for concerted efforts and funds to address ecological crisis, hunger, food insecurity, extreme poverty and supporting the hard to reach populations of the region.

Prof. Barau noted that Africa most especially West Africa is currently embroiled in vulnerabilities and uncertainties that are unconnected to land degradation and climate change.

Also speaking, the Project Manager, Africa Centres of Excellence for Impact (ACE), Dr Sylvia Mkandawire said the Association of African Universities (AAU) would do its best to support this initiative even beyond the project time to transform agricultural landscape not only in West Africa but in the region.

Dr Mkandawire noted that one of the critical issues in the ACE project is sustainability, but assured that it would be one of the issues to be discussed at the next Africa Centres of Excellence for Impact Regional meeting to be held in November this year in Abidjan.

Keynote speeches were delivered during the plenary sessions on the first day by Dr Victor R. Squires, an international dryland management consultant, Adelaide, Australia; Professor Rajeev K. Varshney, Director, State Agricultural Biotechnology Centre, Director, Centre for Crop and Food Innovation, International Chairman in Agriculture and Food Security, Food Futures Institute, Murdoch University, Australia and Kevin Vail Pixley, Wheat and Dryland Crops Programs Director, CIMMYT, Mexico.

KNSG Allays Fear on Payment of Students Registration Fees

Kano State Government has reaffirmed its commitment to the payment of registration fees to all the indigent students of the origin of the state in Bayero University, the state commissioner for Higher Education, Dr. Yusuf Ibrahim Kofar Mata, has said.

Speaking on Monday, 11th September, 2023 when he visited the management of the University, the

Commissioner explained that all arrangements have been concluded for the release of the money, pointing out that the delay was necessitated by the desire to arrive at the exact figure of the beneficiary students.

“Mr. Vice Chancellor sir, you may recall that the government had requested the list of students from Kano State, who were unable to pay the registration, we are now in the process of arriving at a comprehensive list so as not to omit anyone. *In sha Allah*, the process of releasing the

funds have reached advanced stage, we shall release the full list and past it at a designated location for all to see, but because we don't want the registration portal to be closed, I was mandated by His Excellency to come and once more appeal for additional extension so that before then, we shall be able to settle all the fees,” said Dr. Kofar Mata.

He assured the commitment of the Government of Kano State towards fulfilling its undertaking, saying that education has been the priority of the Governor.

Dr. Yusuf Kofar Mata, while applauding the management of Bayero University for its understanding and cooperation, assured that no student would be left behind. “We are going to pay for each and every student, even if the figure is higher than the one earlier supplied,” he assured.

“It's a commitment and there is no going back, I want to assure you that, these monies would soon be paid as we have concluded all the processes at our level, the papers are now with the office of the Accountant General and I am sure as soon as they finished the paper work is completed, the alert will hit your account,' he reaffirmed.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, commended the government of Kano State for the laudable initiative of assisting the indigent students in the payment of the registration fees.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, said the university has never doubted the government on its commitment, assuring that the portal would be further extended in order to allow all students to complete their registration.

“We sincerely appreciate the efforts of His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Kano State along with his counterpart of Jigawa State for their special consideration of our dear University. Insha Allah, we shall do our best to mobilize other public spirited individuals and corporate organizations to support the university's indigent

scholarship program.

It could be recalled that the University Management after due consultations, occasioned by appeal from the Governments of Kano, Jigawa as well as other students union bodies agreed to extend the registration period to the 30th of September, 2023.

Centre for Dryland Agriculture Hosts Food for West Africa Conference

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), hosted the Food for West Africa Network Conference with the theme; *Improving climate -resilient agriculture in west Africa: Leveraging the success of the regional Africa Centres of Excellence.*

Food for West Africa is a network of 7 Africa Centre of Excellence that are agriculture based. They are; Centre of Excellence in Pastoral Productions, Meat, Milk, Leather (CERPP), Universite Abdou Moumouni, Niger Republic; Centre of Excellence in Climate Change, Biodiversity and Sustainable Agriculture (CCBAD); Centre of Excellence in Food Technology and Research (CEFTER), Benue State University, Nigeria; Centre of Excellence for Regulatory Science in Agriculture (CERSA); University of Lome, Togo; Centre of Excellence in Agriculture for Food and Nutrition Security (CEA-AGRISAN), Universite Cheikk Anta Diop, Senegal and Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University, Kano, Nigeria.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who spoke at the opening ceremony on Tuesday, 12th September 2023, said the theme of the conference encapsulated our collective responsibility as educators, researchers and advocates.

Represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, the Vice Chancellor said it was his fervent hope that the participants would have the opportunity to engage in stimulating discussions, share groundbreaking research outputs and experiences and explore innovative strategies and interventions aimed at promoting the holistic development of agriculture.

The Vice Chancellor added that “your collective goal should not only be to identify the current challenges, but also to chart a path forward, one that prioritizes the well-being and potential of every African.

The President of Food for West Africa, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, said the network was formed during its assembly held in Lome, Togo in 2021 with the aim of setting up a platform where the seven ACEs would work in synergy to achieve the objectives of training, research and partnership around food security in sub-Saharan Africa.

Secretary General of the Food for West Africa Network, Professor Kossi Metowogo stated that the four key objectives of the network were to establish a network between professors and students from the different ACEs; disseminate the results of research and innovation through conferences and symposia, as well as create a digital platform and communication activities.

He explained that members of the network are collaborating to seek funding in areas of common interest, citing a partnership between CDA and CCBAD with institutions in Portugal to seek funding from Horizon Europe for a project on Green Energy and climate mitigation.



The ACE Impact Project Manager, Dr Sylvia Mkandawire, in her remarks, said the World Bank and Association of African Universities (AAU) have fully supported the initiative of Food4WA and would continue to provide all the necessary assistance to ensure that the objectives are achieved.

There were keynote speeches from Dr Baloua Nebie from International Maize and Wheat Improvement Centre (CIMMYT); Ambassador Rabiou Dagari, Directorate for Technical Cooperation in Africa; Dr Anthony Whitebread, International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI), Professor Jimmy Adegoke, University of Missouri, Kansas City, USA/African Development Bank and Professor Moses Obasi from CEFTER.

Earlier, the team leader and Project Manager, Dr. Sylvia Mkandawire of Association of African University (AAU) Accra also appreciated the warm reception given to them, saying AAU is subcontracted by the World Bank to support the Africa Centers of Excellence program, with 53 centers in the continent. She also challenged the center to take up on the Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLI) which is of great significance to the world bank and has been an entry point for them into most institutions.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the DVC (Academics), Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel received the team with excitement, saying "it is with great pleasure to welcome you to this very important mission which is review of ongoing projects and resource verification, to one of our most important outfits, a center that is key in uplifting the flag of Bayero University Kano higher and higher.

Expedite Action on Unbundling of Mass Comm Programme ... Varsities Urged

As The National Universities Commission (NUC) is set to start the implementation of the new Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) Curriculum from September 2023, all Nigerian Universities offering Communication and Media Studies programmes have been urged to expedite action to unbundle with a view to starting implementing the CCMAS at CMS Curriculum.

This was part of a resolution adopted after a One-Day Review Meeting held at the Committee of Vice Chancellors Secretariat in Abuja on Friday, 8th September, 2023 which was organised by the Faculty of Communication and Media Studies, Bayero University Kano (BUK), with support from MacArthur Foundation as a follow-up to an earlier meeting held on May 17, 2023 in Kano.

A communiqué signed by Professor Rotimi Olatunji from Lagos State University issued at the end of the meeting noted that only 7 Universities out of 26 have so far complied with the unbundling policy, thus calling for a more commitment to the completion of the NUC CCMAS for the CMS Curriculum for the implementation of the programme it said the call becomes necessary as after three years of the curriculum implementation, accreditation exercise shall be determined by the new CCMAS and institutions who are yet to implement the new curriculum will be at a disadvantage of losing their accreditation.

It could be recall that the journey for the unbundling of the Mass Communication degree into nine programmes in Nigerian universities started in 2018 and was officially launched by the National Universities Commission (NUC) as the new Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) at an official event chaired by the former Vice President, Prof. Yemi Osinbajo in 2022.

Earlier while declaring the meeting open, the Convener and Chair of the BUK-MacArthur Grant Implementation Committee, Prof. Umaru Pate reiterated that the CMS programme curriculum review received broad-based inputs from senior professors and professional bodies/institutions in Nigeria, senior scholars across Africa and in other parts of the world, international stakeholders like UNESCO and MacArthur

Foundation, who participated and supported the various meetings, roundtables and technical sessions. These were further subjected to series of technical reviews by internal and external experts for the NUC. He therefore impressed on members to own up to the document and defend it. He also highlighted that it was the success of the CMS Curriculum review that motivated the NUC to mandate all other disciplines across Nigerian universities to review their curriculum, which led to the development of new CCMAS for all university programmes in Nigeria.

The Meeting was attended by 60 participants, comprising Deans, some selected Heads of Departments and faculty staff, senior professors from Nigerian universities, some foreign universities in the United States(U.S.) and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in the Communication and Media discipline. There were also institutional stakeholder representations from the NUC, Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC), the Nigeria Institute of Public Relations (NIPR) and Media Trust Limited.

The meeting equally identified innovation and entrepreneurship as an important contemporary trend across the world in the Communication and Media industry and Nigeria must take giant strides in that direction to be reckoned with among peers in addition it lamented that Nigerian communication and media studies training lacks strength in equipping graduates with skills and knowledge to practice across multi-platforms.

“After exhaustive deliberations, the meeting observed the need for more partnerships between universities and media organisations on industry-classroom interfaces (for students and lecturers) to obtain practical knowledge and provide solutions to newsrooms. Participants also noted that there are emerging innovations in communication and media businesses and challenges of mainstreaming such in teachings and research, as well as opportunities and challenges of Artificial Intelligence and the internet in undergraduate and postgraduate teachings and research.

The participants while appreciating the efforts of the NUC however, noted the challenges towards the implementation of the CMS CCMAS curriculum, which among others may be

connected to unfavourable attitude of colleagues who are resisting change in the unbundling process/refusing to accept new technologies and innovative ideas, lack of staff development support, poor quality of postgraduate studies, dearth of new ideas on research, difficulties in finding qualified faculty teaching staff and external examiners in some emerging fields and poor relationships between universities and industry. As part of the resolution, participants advised that universities

should strengthen internship programmes and invite industry practitioners to share their experiences with students by institutionalising internship programmes for academic and technical staff/students in partnership with media organisations for industry-classroom interfaces to gain practical knowledge and/provide solutions to newsrooms in specific areas such as audience research, introduction of new programmes and growing a network of contacts in the industry.
