



## Management Suspends Conversion of Generators from Petrol to Gas Powered in the Campus

The Management of Bayero University, Kano has stopped the use of converted cooking gas powered generators in the Campus. It urges all Provosts, Deans, Directors and HODs to ensure compliance.

This was part of the resolutions reached at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> (2023) Principal Officers Meeting held on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2023 and signed by its Secretary, Malam Sheriff A. Ahmed.

It further resolved that the University would collaborate with the Federal Fire Service to seek for clearance for those interested in using *cooking gas* to power their generator. It said until then, any damage caused by use of cooking gas to

power generators would be borne by whosoever was found.

The Principal Officers resolution followed the emergence of a disturbing trend at the University Coke Village, New Campus where some business premises operators without weighing the attendance risk have converted their petrol-powered electricity generators to cooking gas powered.

More worrisome was that aside from business operators at *Coke Village*, some Faculties in the university have also joined the fray and resorted to using cooking gas to power their generators. This must be suspended forthwith.

## BUK Graduates 52 Medical Doctors, Dentists

**B**ayero University, Kano has inducted 52 newly qualified Medical Doctors and Dentists from the Faculties of Clinical Sciences and Dentistry, who took the Hippocratic Oath on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> August, 2023.

The Registrar, Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN), Dr. Tajudeen A. Sunusi, who administered the oath, congratulated the inductees for scaling through a rigorous academic and clinical sojourn. He charge the new Doctors to strictly adhere to the professional ethics of the Medical and Dental professions or else they would have their certificates withdrawn.

Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Management Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, said the Management of the University attached importance to the medical programmes and would continue to provide support and anything necessary to maintain its status as one of the best in the country.

He said the 2023 ranking released by the *Times Higher Education* (THE) of United Kingdom has placed Bayero University as the fourth best university in Nigeria and the 1<sup>st</sup> in terms of international visibility, saying the

performance in medical programmes is one of the areas that attracted huge points for the University.

The Vice Chancellor explained that the Management was working round the clock to assist the students who find it difficult to pay their registration fees, noting that the university has facilitated the payment of scholarship to about 500 indigent students through philanthropists and well-meaning individuals.

He commended the foresight of the Faculties of Clinical Sciences and Dentistry in graduating the new Doctors, who were found worthy in character and learning and hailed the excellent working relationship between the College of Health Sciences and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital.

In his remarks, the Medical Elder, Dr Moshood Oyeninyin advised the new Doctors to respect their parents, teachers, colleagues and fellow staff. He said aside the Hippocratic oaths taken they should observe the ethical principles that included beneficence, non-maleficence, justice and respect of the patient autonomy with rules of confidentiality and veracity.

Earlier in his opening speech, the Chairman of the occasion, who is the Chief Medical Director of Aminu

Kano Teaching Hospital, Professor Abdulrahman Abba Sheshe, said the graduation was a culmination of dedication and hard-work.

The Chairman, who was represented by the Deputy CMAC, Dr Abdullahi Kabir Sulaiman, reminded the inductees that the journey was far from being over, as it marked the beginning of the long journey. He admonished the new Doctors to work towards enhancing the development of the country.

The Chairman further tasked the new Doctors to demonstrate compassion, empathy and the highest standard of care to their patients.

Dr Mohammed A. Haruna, who spoke on behalf of the new Doctors, said the journey was hectic and rigorous, but thanked the Almighty Allah for helping them to achieve this milestone. He thanked their teachers, parents and the University management for all the assistance and support given to them.

The new Doctors were formally welcomed to the Medical and Dental professions by the Chairmen of Nigerian Medical Association (NMA) and NDA, respectively.

The Mambayya House Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, Bayero University, Kano, held a one-day Roundtable Discussion on the theme: The Niger Coup and ECOWAS Intervention: Perspectives on Multi-Sectoral Implications for Nigeria on Wednesday, August 16, 2023 at the Sa'adu Zungur Auditorium Complex.

The discussants that cut across the academia, Women groups, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs), professional groups, Security agencies, Labour unions, public commentators, students and the media among others. In which they critically analysed the current developments in

Niger Republic, its multi-sectorial implications for Nigeria and the unity of the ECOWAS.

The discussants spoke on the political and diplomatic, security, economic, socio cultural and legal as well as constitutional implications of the July 26 2023 coup de'tat a recorded history in West Africa, Africa and even the world at large.

Ambassador Muhammad Bala Sani, Chairman of the event, stated in his welcome address that the ECOWAS should dialogue with the military junta to return power to a democratically elected government. He said: "Waging war with the Republic of Niger is unthinkable because, during times of insecurity, the Republic of Niger housed over 500 thousand Nigerian refugees."

## Dr. Ahmad Maiyaki Takes Over Headship of Business Department

The new Departmental Head of Business Administration, Dr. Ahmad Maiyaki, took over the leadership from the outgoing Prof. Aminu Kurfi on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2023.

In a colorful ceremony attended by the Staff of the Department, the new head of Department solicited the support and cooperation of all and sundry. He employed the staff to work as a family.

Dr. Maiyaki appreciate the confidence repose on him and he prayed to the Almighty to see him through.

In his speech, the outgoing Head of Department, Prof. Aminu Kurfi, thanked Allah for the opportunity given to him. He appreciated the cooperation he got from the staff

Professor Tijjani Naniya, speaking on the historical relationship between Nigeria and Niger, stated that both countries have mutually supported each other on critical issues of national security, including the vital role played by Niger during the Nigerian Civil War (1967-1970) and its current accommodation of Nigerian refugees from the North-East and North-West geopolitical zones.

"The relationship between Nigeria and the Republic of Niger is based on human interaction, region, and commerce."

While Professor Sani Lawal Malumfashi of BUK's Department of Sociology stated that the conflict will have an impact on the socio-cultural relationship between Nigeria and Niger, he also stated that "mistrust will be built socio-culturally and economics will suffer."

During a discussion on the political and diplomatic implications, professor AbubakarJikaJiddere of BUK's Department of Political Science pointed out that military intervention is not a war but rather a forceful intervention to press the junta to hand over power.

Jiddere stated that, in terms of resolving disputes, military intervention is the last resort, stressing that the use of military strategies by the ECOWAS in the first place was wrong. He went on to say that "if war breaks out, Nigeria will bear the heaviest burden."

Speaking on the economic implications, Dr. Abdulssalam Muhammad Kani, an economist at Sa'adatuRimi University of Education, Kano, said: "In 2022, the total trading between Nigeria and Nigeria was estimated at N171 billion, while in 2021, the total export was USD 56.8 million.

At the end of the roundtable some recommendations were suggested but the most important of all was that the ECOWAS should reinstate democracy in the Niger republic which will prevent all issues that arises from military rule or worst case war outbreak due to oppression or external force.

The team leader, Alhaji Muhammad Abdullahi Saidu explained the purpose of visit. He said they were in the

university to monitor the remittance of 25 per cent of the university's internally generated revenue which is expected after students registration.

The DVC Professor Gumel explained to the team the reason of the non remittance saying the university is going through hard times of trying to make ends meet in the aspect of providing the essential services expected of it. He said even with the increment in students registration fees which was inevitable the university is still struggling.

The DVC further explained that the registration is still ongoing as the period of two weeks formerly given was now extended to two months to allow parents cope and prevent drop out due to the increment.

Professor Gumel having explained the struggles of the university solicited for their assistance in explaining to the government that funds given to the university as overhead is not enough to manage the cost of day to day runnings and would even appreciate if the remittance of 25 per cent is removed.

The team Alhaji Saidu Mohammad promised convey back the message and advise accordingly.
