The NUC team inspected departmental clinics, facilities and assessed the libraries, academic matters, staff strength and

other related aspects. The team thanked the University Management and the two departments for giving them all the necessary support and free hand to conduct its assignment.

The team later briefed the Vice Chancellor about the observations made and what needs to be done to improve the programmes. The team leader said the programmes would open vista of opportunities for research and training.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Research and Development, Professor Abdullahi Sule Kano, expressed appreciation to the team for doing a comprehensive assessment that would immensely benefit the university.

On the issue of funding raised by the team, the Vice Chancellor decried the Federal Government's bureaucratic bottleneck that stampedes the funding of university system, noting that it is quite imperative for the government to fund the education for the benefit of the masses. ## CBN Hands Over Centre of Excellence Building to BUK

The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has handed over the Centre of Excellence building to the Management of Bayero University, Kano.

In a brief handing over ceremony on Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, the CBN team led by Mr John Yisa, on behalf of the consultants, structural engineers, mechanical engineers and quantity surveyors handed over one of the biggest edifices in the university to the Vice Chancellor.

The project comprises a faculty building, four departments, deanery, auditoriums, libraries and food court. It has 190 rooms hostel block with gym, restaurant, laundry and mini reading rooms.

The edifice has a utility block comprising 4 units of 500 KVA generators, synchronizing panels, pumps for water supply and firefighting equipment.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Research and Development, Professor Abdullahi Sule Kano, said the

University was overwhelmed with the handing over of the edifice which would expand the facilities and provide environment conducive for lecture, research and training. It would also provide decent hostel accommodation, hostel facilities and accommodate four departments.

He said the University would put the facilities into good use and thanked the CBN for its intervention in the project.

# SUG President Sadauki Unveils 5-Point Agenda

*...Students Welfare, Adequate Water Supply, Price Regulation Take Centre Stage*

The newly elected President of the Student Union Government (SUG), Comrade Aliyu Abdullahi Mahmud Sadauki, has unveiled his five-point agenda for the students of Bayero University, Kano with students' welfare, adequate water supply and regulation of prices of commodities as some of his main priorities.

The President, who unveiled his agenda on Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, said in his capital project, provision of adequate water supply would be pursued with renewed vigor in collaboration with the Dean, Student Affairs and the University Management. He said the SUG would liaise with the Director of Security to introduce a special taskforce to beef up surveillance especially in the female hostels.

The second agenda according to the president is regulating the price of commodities for the students to buy at affordable price. He said there would be a market day every Wednesday in which foodstuffs and other essential commodities would be displayed by major dealers at the front of Ramat Hall for students in the new campus and Nana Hall for Old campus students. This he said would compel others at the Cock Village to reduce the prices of commodities.

He noted that he would use marketing strategies being a student of Business Administration to ensure that students buy essential commodities at affordable prices.

The President explained the third aspect which is the introduction of summer classes for students with carry over and spill-over. He said as the University maintains its international ranking as the best in the entire northern Nigeria and among the best five in Nigeria, summer classes would further strengthen the University's international standard. He said SUG would approach the University Management to implement this laudable initiative.

The fourth agenda according to him is to intimate the University Management to introduce an online result and do away with pasting of semester results on notice boards. He said as practiced in advanced countries, students could

check their results via their mobile phones.

Comrade Sadauki's fifth agenda is reviving social activities on all the campuses of the university and creating other social engagements. He said his administration would collaborate with private companies and artists who will come and entertain the students on monthly basis. He added that students centres would be brought back to life so



that students can watch football live and socialize among themselves.

The President urged the students, staff and all the stakeholders to pray for him and the entire executives and Students Representative Assembly (SRA) to succeed, noting that the main priority is the welfare of students.

The President, who unveiled his five point agenda at the Bulletin Office, was accompanied by Saeed Abubakar aka Aluta General.

## Mambayya House Organizes Roundtable Discussion on Coup DETA'T and ECOWAS Intervention

The Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, Mambayya House, Bayero University, Kano, held a one-day Roundtable Discussion on the theme: The Niger Coup and ECOWAS Intervention: Perspectives on Multi-Sectoral Implications for Nigerian on Wednesday, August 16, 2023 at the Sa'adu Zungur Auditorium Complex.

The discussants were drawn from the academia, Women groups, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs), professional groups, Security agencies, labour unions, public commentators, students and the media among others. Discussants and participants critically discussed the current developments in Niger Republic, its multi-sectoral implications for Nigeria

and the unity of the ECOWAS.

The discussants spoke on the political and diplomatic, security, economic, socio cultural and legal and constitutional implications of the coup which happened on July 26, 2023 a recorded history in West Africa, Africa and even the world at large.

Amb. Muhammad Bala Sani, Chairman of the event, stated in his welcome address that the ECOWAS should dialogue with the military junta to return power to a democratically elected government. He said: "Waging war with the Republic of Niger is unthinkable because, during times of insecurity, the Republic of Niger housed over 500 thousand Nigerian refugees."



Professor Tijjani Naniya, speaking on the historical relationship between Nigeria and Niger, stated that both countries have mutually supported each other on critical issues of national security, including the vital role played by Niger during the Nigerian Civil War (1967-1970) and its current accommodation of Nigerian refugees from the North-East and North-West geopolitical zones.

“The relationship between Nigeria and the Republic of Niger is based on human interaction, region, and commerce.”

While Professor Sani Lawal Malumfashi of BUK's Department of Sociology stated that the conflict would have an impact on the socio-cultural relationship between Nigeria and Niger.

During a discussion on the political and diplomatic implications, professor Abubakar Jika Jiddere of BUK's Department of Political Science pointed out that military intervention is not a war but rather a forceful intervention to press the junta to hand over power.

Jiddere stated that, in terms of resolving disputes, military intervention is the last resort, stressing that the use of military strategies by the ECOWAS in the first place was wrong. He went on to say that “if war breaks out, Nigeria will bear the

heaviest burden.”

Speaking on the economic implications, Dr. Abdulssalam Muhammad Kani, an economist at Sa'adatu Rimi University of Education, Kano, said: “In 2022, the total trading between Nigeria and Niger was estimated at N171 billion, while in 2021, the total export was USD 56.8 million.

At the end of the roundtable, some recommendations were made but the most important of all was that the ECOWAS should reinstate democracy in the Niger Republic which will prevent all issues that arise from military rule or worst case war outbreak due to oppression or external force.
