BUK a Model of Good University ...Says Prof. B.B Shehu

Bayero University, Kano is a model of how good University ought to have been, says Professor B.B Shehu, noting that the medical facilities provided by the University at the College of Health Sciences were among the best he ever saw.

Speaking during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas on Tuesday, 2nd May, 2023, Professor Shehu, who is leading an NUC State of Medical Education Assessment team said he and his team were excited with the quality and quantity of the facilities provided for teaching and research in the university's medical school.

He expressed delight that despite the cash squeeze facing tertiary institutions, yet Bayero University had done this much. "It really showed the level of commitment and patriotic leadership in the University," he said.

According to him, the facilities they saw at the University's College of Health Sciences were of high quality in addition to being sufficient for 150 medical students. This is indeed a good development. And with this, it is apt for one to say that "Bayero University is a model of what a good university ought to be in terms of quality of facilities, structures and personnel. I was once a Vice Chancellor and

I know what it takes to provide these," he revealed.

"Mr Vice Chancellor, sir, we are here on the instruction of the National Universities Commission to go round and get comprehensive data on the state of medical education in the country and we are really excited with what we saw," he declared.

"We are not in any way here on fault finding but rather to assess the facilities, so as to have comprehensive data on what needed to be in place in order to improve on our program. Without having comprehensive data, it would be difficult to make any projection for future development," Prof. Shehu added.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abbas said the Management of Bayero University always strived hard to provide the needed facilities, pointing out that the institution was laid on a foundation of quality and standards. "We don't compromise on these," he said.

According to him, the university was always ready and willing to learn and improve on its services. "We have respect for high standards and quality in all aspects, anybody who is not ready for this would be shelved away". He thanked the team for their observations and promised to make improvement where there was any lapse.

Dean Veterinary Medicine Inaugurates Anti Rabies Vaccination Committee

The Dean, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Bayero University, Kano, Prof. Abdussamad M. Abdussamad has inaugurated the Organizing Committee for the Antirabies Campaign in the University and some selected communities. This follows the receipt of the donation of 10,000 doses of antirabies vaccine by the Faculty from the Federal Department of Veterinary and Pest Control Services of the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, Abuja.

In his remarks during the inauguration ceremony, which was held at the Conference Hall of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) on Monday 17th April, 2023, Prof. Abdussamad explained that as part of its community service obligation. The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine intended to take advantage of this donation to engaged in intensive campaign against rabies by enlightening the university community and the general public about the menace of the disease as well as engaging in rabies vaccination. The project he said his aimed at reaching the global goal of zero dog-mediated rabies deaths by 2030 through bringing different stakeholders to work together and collaborate and employ a One Health approach.

According to the Dean, the control of zoonotic diseases employing the One Health approach formed part of the policy thrust of the nascent Faculty of Veterinary Medicine BUK. The Dean further explained that it was important to carry out this campaign and sensitize the university community and the general public on the disease considering that rabies was a preventable disease yet more than 59,000 people die annually from it and that 99% of all rabies transmissions to humans were from dogs.

Members of the Committee, according to Prof. Abdussamad, were carefully selected based on their pedigree as selfless individuals committed to team work, collaborative spirit and intellectual capacity. He urged them to carry out this assignment diligently and submit their report within four weeks from the date of the inauguration.

The Committee's part of its terms of reference (ToR), to determine the areas to be covered during the campaign, assess what is on the ground, provide a list of what is required give a breakdown of cost implications and suggest any other activity pursuant to this assignment.

The 17-member Committee has Dr. Mustapha I. Sanda, Ag. Director, Bayero University Veterinary Teaching Hospital (BUVTH) and Dr. Bakari Ado Hussaini Ag. HOD, Veterinary Pathobiology as Chairman and Co-Chairman respectively, while Dr. Muhammad U. Yuguda is to serve as Secretary.
