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he West African Research and Innovation adding that individuals appear to work in "silos" with Management Association (WARIMA) in collaboration with Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) held a five-day extensive training on Research Management. The training took place from 9th to 13th September, 2024 at ACEPHAP head office, Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH).

The training was a fall-out of the visit by WARIMA team in May 2024, to ACEPHAP, and Yusuf Maitama Sule University, Kano (YUMSUK) and held interactive sessions with them aimed at looking at the performance of their research activities and render support where necessary.

Professor Emeh Owoaje, one the resource persons explained that based on the report of the reviews made by the WARIMA team on the status of some African research institutes, it was established that all the institutions have some form of institutional arrangements/ offices supporting the grant application process. The capacities in these offices vary and their scope also varies because the focus was very much on the grant application.

She added that it was discovered that the overall view of research management (RM) in the institutions was weak,

limited engagement amongst the different players in the research management service function. For effective service delivery, she said it was important that staff have a solid and strong understanding of the linkages in their roles and that "this training will provide that overview for all the staff involved in the research management (RM) function."

Professor Owoaje, said it was in an effort to address the observed lapses that WARIMA collaborated with ACEPHAP to organize the training for ACEPHAP researchers, Yusuf Maitama Sule University scientists, staff of Directorate of Research Innovation and Partnership, BUK, researchers at the College of Health Sciences and Research Office of Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital aimed at equipping them with essential research management knowledge for them to support and run research effectively and efficiently in their institutions.

Also speaking via zoom, Dembo B Kanteh MRC Gambia, President of WARIMA stated that the workshop was aimed at training staff involved in the delivery of the research and innovation management function at these institutions on the broad spectrum of the Research Management roles as it

would enable them to have a greater understanding of the function, connect them to the wider global Research Management environment, establish synergies amongst the service providers and hopefully a more effective service to the scientific community.

At the end of the training participants would gain a comprehensive understanding of research management and its broad scope, identify effective processes for searching and applying for funding opportunities to support researchers within their institutions. Additionally, participants would develop an awareness of the complexities of modern-day research and the importance

of building strong, meaningful collaborations.

They would also learn to recognize the challenges institutions face in maintaining compliance within a highly regulated research environment. Furthermore, participants would receive valuable tips in engaging with stakeholders who use research findings to enable them to maximize the impact of research outputs.

Other resource persons who presented papers at the workshop were: Professor Aisha Fofana Ibrahim, Elizabeth Stanley Batchilly; Dr. Akindele Adebiyi, Dr. Adebowale Adetayo and Dr. Phil Clare.

Handover of Tissue Culture Laboratory and Greenhouses: Strengthening Capacity in Agricultural Research

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) returned its old partition, air conditioners and green house. In addition, the Department of Agronomy, on Wednesday, October 16th, 2024, after building a new one inside the Regional Agribusiness Innovation Hub (RAIHub).

The Director of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture, (CDA), Prof. Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, expressed appreciation on behalf of the Centre to the Department of Agronomy. In his words, "First of all, we thank the former Head of the Department of Agronomy, Prof. Sanusi Gaya, very much for allowing us to convert a space reserved for laboratories in their department to the CDA Plant Tissue-Culture Lab." He added, "Now we are happy to announce that we have relocated the plant tissue culture laboratory to the RAIHub building for the continuation of research and commercial activities. Therefore, we deemed it necessary to formally hand over the former lab to the Department and are delighted to relinquish possession with some improved and functional facilities. "These include a fully functional laboratory furniture with plumbing, gas piping and gas cylinders, 10 KVA inverter with solar panels, aluminum

Tissue Culture Laboratory to the original owner, the CDA also graciously handed over the green house at the CDA Annex to Department of Crop Protection.

> He further expressed firmness in the Centre's decision, stating that they believed the Agronomy Department is proactive in research and encouraged them to utilize the lab productively. Similarly, the nature of research in crop protection requires an isolated green house for the conduct of research especially with pathogens. He also stated they are leaving the Greenhouses with the Faculty and charged the staff to sustain them for conducting research activities especially at postgraduate levels.

> The Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. Muhammad Auwal Hussain showed gratitude to the Centre for returning the research facilities enhanced and instructed the staff of the department to ensure maximum utilisation and maintain it for proper use of the facilities. He promised that the Faculty will work together with the department to equip the research lab with the necessary equipment and consumables through support from the University management.

Dr. Fatima's Presentation at Kenyan Workshop .. Major Plus for ACEPHAP By Bala G. Abdullahi

Researchers and policymakers from Kenya, Nigeria and participants to adapt their research to have greater policy Ethiopia came together for a Policy Engagement and Science Communication Workshop in Nairobi, Kenya from 7th to 9th October, 2024, organized by the African Population and Health Research Center (APHRC).

The Policy Engagement & Science Communication Workshop was aimed at creating an ecosystem that fosters collaboration between researchers and policymakers, enabling co-creation and effective implementation of research findings. The workshop, which brought together researchers, policy experts, and communication professionals from the three participating countries was to enhance evidence-informed policymaking (EIPM), bridge research-to-policy gaps, and strengthen the communication of research findings.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, the Executive Director of APHRC, Dr. Catherine Kyobutungi, welcomed the participants and stated that the objective of the workshop was empowering participants with practical skills to enhance the relevance of research in policy settings and

influence.

Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) was represented at the workshop by Dr. Fatima Muhammad, the project manager of the Kano State Surveillance for Evidence and Policy Project (KASSEP). Her presentation highlighted collaborative experiences among researchers and governments, which is the perspective from the African Center of Excellence for Population Health & Policy (ACEHAP) in Bayero University, Kano.

She also used the KASSEP Project as a case study to focus on sustainable collaboration between researchers and policymakers for evidence-informed decision making which she said remained the key to research successes.

Dr. Shehu Abdullahi, the Director of Medical Services represented the Kano State Government. Other presentations were from participants from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and Ethiopia's Ministry of Health. Each speaker shared insights into



communicate findings effectively.

He said APHRC's commitment to supporting evidenceinformed policy development was evident, and the diverse topics covered prepared participants from Nigeria, Ethiopia, and Kenya to make significant contributions to policy impact and science communication.

Dr. Alphonsus Neba provided an overview of the Catalyze Impact Initiative, setting the stage for discussions on integrating evidence into policy.

Gaye Agesa in his address, discussed APHRC's Catalyze approach, emphasizing the importance of research that addresses specific policy needs and considers practical implications. This approach aimed to empower

collaborative processes, challenges, and success stories.

Lynette Kamau introduced knowledge translation principles and the knowledge-to-action cycle, providing strategies for research to influence policy effectively. Participants then developed policy briefs based on their research, presenting drafts and receiving feedback in a collaborative setting.

On Media Communication and Digital Presence, Julius Maina and Moina Spooner led a session on writing for nonscientific audiences, pitching research articles, and communicating effectively with the media. The session emphasized adapting complex research findings for broader public engagement.

Faculty of Engineering Holds Seminars on Ensuring Integrity in the Conduct of Examination

The Faculty of Engineering organized a series of seminars to address the critical issue of **ensuring integrity in the conduct of examinations**. These seminars were held on different dates for both staff and students, with each session tailored to the specific roles and responsibilities of the participants.

The seminar for staff, which took place on Tuesday, 20th August 2024, brought together academic and administrative personnel involved in examination management. The seminar took place at the faculty conference room.

In his opening remarks, the Dean, Prof Mohammed Shua'ibu Abubakar FNSE, stressed the value of integrity in education, explaining how examination misconduct undermines both the student's learning experience and institution's credibility. He called on all staff to work together to ensure highest standards of academic excellence and ethical conduct is upheld.

In their separate speeches, the key speakers, Professor Ibrahim Abdullahi (Mechanical Engineering), Dr Gambo Haruna Yunusa (Civil Engineering) and Malam Mahfuz Zubair Ibrahim (Directorate of Examinations, Admission and Records), outlined the strategies and compliance with rules and regulations governing examinations and the roles of staff in enforcing these standards.

They gave detailed explanation of the procedures for handling cases of examination malpractice and strategies on how to detect and prevent cheating during examinations. Emphasis was placed on creating a fair and stress-free examination environment, where students are

less likely to resort to dishonest behavior.

The Faculty Examination Officer, Dr. Sunusi Marwana Manladan, thanked everyone for their input and emphasized the importance of open communication in addressing concerns about examination integrity. He stressed that upholding the integrity of the examination system is not the task of a single office or individual- it requires a joint effort from all of us. He assured the audience that all feedback would be considered for improving the examination processes.

On Thursday, 3rd October 2024, a similar seminar was conducted for students at the Electrical Engineering Department.

The Dean, Professor M S Abubakar, who was represented by the Deputy Dean, Dr. Adamu Abubakar Rasheed, stressed that Bayero University Kano has clear policies and penalties for those who engage in misconduct, and ignorance of these rules is not an excuse.

The lead speakers Dr. Mubarak Danladi Muhammad (Mechanical Engineering) and Dr. Gambo Haruna Yunusa (Civil Engineering) in their separate speeches emphasized the importance of understanding and adhering to the rules and regulations. The speakers further advised students to take personal responsibility for their actions, maintain academic honesty, and report any observed incidents of malpractice to the appropriate authorities

The Head of Chemical and Petroleum Engineering Department, Dr Omar Umar Ahmed in his short remarks encouraged the students to value integrity and hard work, as these principles lay the foundation for future success.

BUK Pharm Students Visit Nigeria's Mega Drugs Distribution Center

The Pharmaceutical Association of Nigerian Students using their license. However, she clarified that the center, (PANS), Bayero University Chapter visited one of Nigeria's Mega Drug Distribution Centers (Coordinate Wholesale Center) at Dangwauro located in Kano as part of its training modules. The tour which took place on 22nd August, 2024 was led by the Sub-Dean, Academics, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dr. Sulaiman Danladi.

The primary objective of the tour was to educate the students who are the future pharmacists to be knowledgeable on safe drugs distribution and disposition, including the vast opportunities in the field of Pharmacy.

Apart from the CWC Dangwauro, there were three counter-proposed centres that are yet to commence operations. These centers are to be located in three cities of Lagos, Aba and Onitsha respectively.

Addressing the students, Pharmacist Hajiya Huraira, who is the head of the Center, highlighted the centre's objectives, saying that the primary purpose of the center was to eliminate unauthorized open drug marketing due to disorganized medicine sales and supply, which is the primary cause of sub-standard and falsified medicine circulation.

The center, she revealed, partnered with Kano Pharmaceutical Partnership (KPP), an association of experienced licensed pharmacists and registered drug dealers of Kano. KPP facilitates smooth drug transactions among partners, with administrators assigned to various tasks, including a

task force for drug pickup and delivery within and outside the center.

Pharm. Huraira revealed the vast opportunities which await pharmacists, including the center's capacity to employ over 1,800 pharmacists or more, where each pharmacist is permitted to operate five different stores

being the first of its kind in the country, faced challenges and may not meet the intake of 1,800 initially. She approved the students' request for an opportunity to undergo industrial training at the center.

Also speaking, the President of the Pharmaceutical Association of Nigerian Students, BUK Chapter, Comrade Abubakar Haruna Yusuf, who led the students, expressed gratitude for the opportunity and the experience, which he said would go a long way to add to their knowledge on the field. He requested for an opportunity for the students to undergo their industrial training there.

He said the tour was a valuable experience that exposed the



vast opportunities in the pharmaceutical industry. "We are delighted for all the rich information shared on different valuable aspects. We look forward to applying the knowledge and skills gained. As future pharmacists, we are inspired to make a positive impact in the healthcare sector," Comrade Yusuf remarked.
