Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano in a brief remarks shortly after the signing of the documents on Tuesday, 5th November, 2024 at NASENI headquarters, Abuja,, welcomed the collaboration, describing it as a "good development for the sustainable development of the University."

Application of Simulation in Healthcare:

Boston Hospital Collaborates with ACEPHAP ... Trains Doctors, Nurses and Midwives

Boston Children's Hospital, a Harvard University Medical tendencies that hampers physical teaching and learning, School Teaching Hospital, USA held a five-day intensive virtual, active and digital learning had become inevitable. training workshop on the application of healthcare Simulation.



The workshop which was part of the implementation of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the Hospital and Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) took place at the center's conference hall, Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, from Monday 28th October to Saturday 2nd November, 2024.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, the Director of ACEPHAP, Professor Hadiza Galadanci said the workshop was a dream come true. She explained that it had been her desire even before ACEPHAP to switch to active study and digital learning in tertiary institutions, but added that the emergence of COVID-19 and other disruptive

Professor Galadanci said in the past, students at the medical schools were opportune to attend practical sessions using human anatomy, but the situation has changed today which makes the use of simulation for teaching practical sessions inevitable.

She disclosed that the workshop was made possible after a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between ACEPHAP and the Boston Hospital. Professor Galadanci thanked the team of resource persons led by Assistant Professor Michelle Niescierenko and her colleagues for taken the pains to travel from the United States to Kano to conduct the all-important training.

To the participants, Professor Galadanci charged them to make the best use of the opportunity, saying that "we brought these simulation experts to Kano so that we can all benefit. Please practice all that you have learnt. We have a simulation laboratory in the Center, make the best use of the facilities," she advised.

Also speaking, the lead resource person, Assistant Professor of Pediatrics, Michelle Niescierenko who is also a Simulation educator, said the objective of the training was to run the workshop for two co-horts in order to train 35 persons among the College of Health Sciences faculty staff. The aim is for them to use simulation as educators so that they could now go and design their own cases to run their own teaching session with students at Bayero University and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital.

Shedding more light on simulation, Professor Michelle said Simulation is when one uses models from mockup to practice medical scenarios and procedures first, and teach professionals understand the operation of the mockup before they now go into real life and practice them.

She said the significance of simulation cannot be overemphasized, saying that it has really become the most modern way of educating nurses, doctors and midwives. It is also a modern education methodology deserves for patient safety.

Professor Michelle said the number of the workshop participants are the largest set to be trained on simulation in the country, and thanked ACEPHAP Director, Professor Galadanci for facilitating the training. She advised the participants to make the best use the opportunity not only to learn, but also to put into practice what they have learnt.

She said four team of resource persons conducted that the training; They are: Professor Michelle Niescierenko, MD, MPH Director, Global Health Programme, Jennifer Arnold, Simulation Director, Branna O'Connell Adult Education and Rebecca Williams, Simulation Operation Specialist.

The training workshop drew participants from ACEPHAP, Departments of Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology as well as Nursing Sciences.
