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ACEPHAP on Track for International Accreditation ... Experts Assess two Postgraduate Programmes

n a significant step towards cementing its reputation as a center of excellence, the Bayero University's Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) received an international assessment team to evaluate two of its postgraduate programs for accreditation.

The team's visit, which took place on Monday, 11th November, 2024 aimed to assess the programs' quality, relevance, and impact on the field of public health in West and Central Africa and by extension the African continent.

As ACEPHAP strives to promote population health outcomes through training and research, this accreditation would further endorse its commitment to excellence and enhance its graduates' prospects in the global health landscape.

The resource verification team from Agency for Public Health Education Accreditation (APHEA) on arrival paid a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor Professor Sagir

Adamu Abbas on Monday, 11th November, 2024 at the SBC Committee Room.

The team leader, Professor Julien David Goodman said the team was in Kano to assess facilities in the University for the international accreditation of the M.Sc in Public Health, Nursing and Policy (MPHNP) and Masters in Maternal Child Health and Policy.

The exercise is part of the routine checks to ensure quality and standards in line with international best practices.

Earlier, the Director, Africa Centre of Excellence for Population, Health and Policy (ACEPHAP), Professor Hadiza Galadanci who gave a brief background of the centre, explained that since its establishment it attracted grants from World Bank and other reputable international donor agencies.

She also revealed that ACEPHAP has been in collaboration with many research centres and other tertiary institutions within africa and other continents including Europe and America.

Professor Galadanci while appreciating the support and assistance renderd to the Centre by the Management of the University, noted that this has made it to be among the best research centres not only in the country but Africa as a whole.

In his brief remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, reaffirmed the commitment of the Management of the University to provide an enabling environment conducive for learning and teaching.

Represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor Academics, Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, revealed that Bayero University was ranked as amongst the best ten universities in the country by the 2025 Times Higher Education (THE) World University Ranking.

According to him, this feat was recorded based on the University's adherence to quality and standards, he assured them of all necessary support and cooperation with a view

to ensuring that all the necessary facilities are provided to the specifications of international standards.

He said it was based on these qualities that BUK was ranked as the overall best university in Nigeria in terms of international outlook, saying programmes mounted by ACEPHAP have contributed in attracting international students.

The team had interacted with various stakeholders from across directorates and units including the Director ACEPHAP, Provost College of Postgraduate Studies, the heads of departments of the programmes under assessment, Director Academic Planning, Director Career Service Centre, head of Public Affairs, Director DEAR, Dean Students Affairs, Director SERVICOM and students respectively.

African Nations Pledge Unprecedented Decade-long Education Reform to Transform the Futures of Millions of Children

unanimous decision adopted an ambitious vision to eliminate learning poverty in the continent by 2035.

A communiqué issued at the end of the 2024 Africa Foundational Learning Exchange (FLEX 2024), held in Kigali, Rwanda from 11th to 13th November 2024, 22 Ministers of Education, and 12 Heads of Ministerial Delegations from 34 countries in Africa endorsed the African Union's call to declare a 'Decade of Education', aimed at tackling the continent's learning crisis.

The World Bank has predicted that success could unlock Africa's contribution to the global economy, to the tune of \$6.5 trillion in economic potential by 2030. Conversely, failure to act threatens catastrophic consequences - an estimated \$17 trillion in lifetime learning losses across low and middle-income countries globally.

This stark contrast underscores the critical importance of immediate, decisive action to transform Africa's educational landscape.

These considerations followed the passionate appeal by the Guest of Honour at FLEX, Her Excellency, Mrs Jeanette Kagame, the First Lady of the Republic of Rwanda, during her keynote address that officially launched the convening of leaders.

The First Lady clearly articulated the challenges facing the continent to include poor reading and comprehension among children aged 10 and below.

"Reading and comprehension of simple texts is still an issue for 9 out of 10 children aged 10 and below, in the majority of African countries. What a loud alarm bell this statistic rings," declared.

Learning and critical thinking, increase primary education completion rates, and allocate more resources to education, specifically to the more vulnerable learners, the consequences is enormous. She advised that deliberate action must be taken to address the issue of their skills development, employability, and social welfare.

The Rwanda's First Lady's passionate appeal was reechoed by the President of Zambia and Africa Champion of Foundational Learning Mr. Hakainde Hichelima who said in his remarks.

"We need to start thinking more strategically about innovative models of funding education and to use our resources more effectively. We need to implement Africa's educational journey

In a landmark decision, African education leaders have in a evidence-based approaches and scale what works to improve foundational learning on the continent and we need robust accountability mechanisms at national, regional, and continental levels for both partners and governments."

> The summit, attended by over 540 global education leaders and featuring 25 technical sessions, culminated in a fivepoint declaration that will transform the landscape of African education. The five core commitments are:

> Set and achieve a continental target of zero learning poverty by 2035 through concentrated investment in foundational skills and systematic measurement of progress across all participating nations.

> The summit equally, agreed for full endorsement and implementation of the African Union's Decade of Education initiative, mobilizing resources and political will for sustained educational transformation.

> They also vowed to establish robust inter-country collaboration frameworks to facilitate knowledge exchange, share best practices, and create synergistic



According to her failure to strengthen Foundational learning opportunities across African nations and scale evidence-based interventions through efficient resource allocation, focusing on proven methodologies that demonstrably improve foundational learning outcomes at the country level.

> The Ministers promised to implement comprehensive data and accountability mechanisms to track progress, ensure quality assessment, and coordinate partner initiatives for maximum impact across the continent.

> This unprecedented collaboration between governments, and development partners including the World Bank, ADEA, UNICEF, USAID, FCDO, Hempel Foundation, New Globe, and UNESCO, marks a turning point in

Faculty of Engineering Holds Seminars on Ensuring Integrity in the Conduct of Examination for Staff and Students

The Faculty of Engineering organized a series of seminars also stressed the importance of strict adherence to rules and to address the critical issue of ensuring integrity in the conduct of examinations. These seminars were held on different dates for both staff and students, with each session tailored to the specific roles and responsibilities of the participants.

The seminar for staff, which took place on Tuesday, 20th August 2024, brought together academic and administrative personnel involved in examination management. The seminar took place at the faculty conference room and began with an opening address by the Dean, Prof Mohammed Shua'ibu Abubakar FNSE, who stressed the value of integrity in education, explaining how examination misconduct undermines both the student's learning experience and institution's credibility. He called on all staff to work together to ensure highest standards of

regulations and outlined the University's Senate policies and regulations guiding students and staff on acceptable conduct during examinations.

The seminar transitioned into an interactive Question and Answer Session. This segment provided an opportunity for the staff to seek clarifications on academic related inquest and offer suggestions on how to improve the integrity of the examination process. The Faculty Examination Officer, Dr. Sunusi Marwana Manladan thanked everyone for their input and emphasized the importance of open communication in addressing concerns about examination integrity. He stressed that upholding the integrity of the examination system is not the task of a single office or individual- it requires a joint effort from all of us. He assured the audience that all feedback would be considered for improving the examination processes.

Prof Ibrahim Abdullahi outlined the strategies and Deputy Dean, Dr. Adamu Abubakar Rasheed, while representing the Dean commended the faculty examination office for organizing such seminar for the students, which he described as apt and timely, saying that explanation of the procedures for handling cases of it was meant to remind students of the importance of academic honesty and the consequences of engaging in examination misconduct. He stressed that Bayero University Kano has clear policies and penalties for those who engage in misconduct, and ignorance of these rules is not an excuse. The lead speakers were former faculty examination officers, Dr. Mubarak Danladi Muhammad (Mechanical Engineering) and Dr. Gambo Haruna Yunusa

Emphasis was placed on creating a fair and stress-free examination environment, where students are less likely to resort to dishonest behavior. The session was further enriched by Malam Mahfuz Zubair, who provide valuable insights on the pivotal role of the examinations, admission and records in maintaining the integrity of the examination process. During his presentation, Dr. Mubarak highlighted the importance of understanding and adhering to the rules and regulations. He provided clear guidance on the acceptable and prohibited behaviors during the conduct of examinations, emphasizing the importance of adhering to institutional rules to maintain fairness and integrity. The speaker further advised students to take personal responsibility for their actions, maintain academic honesty, and report any observed incidents of malpractice to the appropriate authorities.

Dr. Gambo Haruna Yunusa addressed the immediate and long-term consequences of engaging in examination misconduct. He informed students of the severe academic and disciplinary consequences of cheating, including suspension, rustication, expulsion and damage to their academic records. Real life examples of anonymous students who faced these consequences were shared to reinforce the message. He also provided clear guidance on the appropriate actions for students to take if they find themselves caught in examination misconduct. Both speakers recommended that students familiarize themselves with the institution's academic integrity

policies contained in the general examination and academic regulations (GEAR).

The Head of Chemical and Petroleum Engineering, Dr Omar Umar Ahmed in his short remarks encouraged the students to value integrity and hard work, as these principles lay the foundation for future success. Following the informative presentations, the session transitioned into a dynamic Q&A segment where students had the opportunity to seek clarification and express their concerns regarding examination conduct and the best practices.

In his closing remarks, the Faculty Examination Officer, Dr. Sunusi Marwana Manladan urged the students to avoid engaging in any form of examination misconduct. He stated that academic dishonesty is not only detrimental in the short term but can have far-reaching effects on one's career and personal life.

Overall, the two seminars were successful in raising awareness about the importance of maintaining integrity during examinations and equipping both staff and students of the faculty with the knowledge and tools to uphold ethical standards in their academic endeavors.


