As the Federal Government launched the National The official launching of the Nigeria Education Loan Fund received the highest allocation.

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu presented a cheque of the first batch of successful candidates of six hundred and ninety eight million four hundred and four thousand and eight hundred naira (N698, 404, 800.00) to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas.

Student's Loans Scheme, Bayero University, Kano, (NELFUND) held on Wednesday, 17th July, 2024 in Abuja with the President reaffirming his commitment to inclusiveness and ensuring sufficient funding to sustain the program.

According to him the government would continue to invest in education to empower its citizens and would deploy it as a tool against terrorism, banditry, and insecurity.

The President, who symbolically presented loan cheques to students from each geo-political zone, indicating the beginning of the disbursement of the fund to qualified

In his remarks, the Executive Secretary of the NELFUND, Mr. Akintonde Sawyerr, said a total of 164,000 students registered for the loan. He said that a N33 billion is currently available for disbursement to kick-start the programme. He said NELFUND aimed at empowering Nigerian youth by providing fair, transparent funding and removing financial barriers to educational opportunities and academic pursuits

A total of 8,530 candidates from Bayero University benefitted from the NELFUND scheme out of the 9,836 registered candidates.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who disclosed this on Friday, 19th July, 2024 shortly after receiving an award of honour from the Students' Union Government in his office, disclosed that the University got the highest allocation of the newly introduced National Students Loans Scheme.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abbas, expressed gratitude for the award and thanked the Students' Union Government for the recognition. He charged them to concentrate on their studies with a view to coming out with flying colours.

SSANU, NASU Members Protes Payment of Withheld Salaries By Nura Garba

Nigerian Universities (SSANU) and its counterpart from the Non-Academic Staff Union of Universities (NASU) at Bayero University Kano (BUK) led their members to a peaceful protest around the campus over the non-payment of their four months withheld salaries by the federal government.

This action followed a directive from the national body of the Joint Action Committee (JAC) of the unions to embark on a one-day peaceful protest pressing home their demands on the agreement reached during the suspension of its strike sometimes in 2022.

Comrade Mustapha Aminu, Chairman of the University's Joint Action Committee (JAC), while addressing the Congress, highlighted the grievances of the non-teaching staff. "While the federal government settled part of the withheld salaries of the teaching staff union, we, the non-teaching staff, were left behind. Despite our pleas, nothing has been done, so we are peacefully seeking our rights," he stated.

He noted that the staff's demand for immediate payment of our outstanding arrears is seen as essential not only for their welfare but also for maintaining the overall functionality and quality of education at the institution.

Aminu called on President Bola Ahmed Tinubu to intervene and address their concerns, stressing the urgency for government to pay the affected members in order to bring succor to their sufferings.

The JAC Chairman also pointed out the broader implications of the protest, particularly on the students. "This action affects the education of the students because very soon, they will resume lectures. If the non-teaching staff are on strike, the students will

The leadership of the Senior Staff Association of not have a conducive learning environment," he explained.

Chairman of NASU, BUK Chapter, comrade Abdullahi Nasiru, urged the federal government to respond to the protesters' demands." We want the government to pay our withheld salaries so that the education system of the country will not collapse," he said.

The five-day retreat took place at the CBN Centre of Excellence at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria from Monday, July 1, 2024 to Friday, July 5, 2024.

Discussions and deliberations were centered around the take-off of the new postgraduate (M.Sc and Ph.D) Programmes mounted by the Center, Developing a framework for Regional Agri-Business Innovation Hub (RAIHub), the completion of the CDA strategic Plan for the 2024-2029, Finalization of the CDA Research Strategy and overall Sustainability plan for the Centre.

In his address to declare the meeting open, the Director of CDA, Professor Jibrin Mohammed JIbrin gave a historical evolution of the Centre, enumerated key challenges faced and how they were overcome as well as highlighted the need for the retreat participants to support the Centre in its drive to come up with a sustainability plan after the exhaustion of the Africa Centre of Excellence (ACE) Project.

As an ice breaker, participants were asked to share their experiences with the CDA in which they commended the laudable achievements recorded by the center over the years.

The Vice Chancellor of Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria, Professor Kabir Bala, visited the participants on Tuesday, July 2, 2024, marking a significant moment. He congratulated the Center for the successes it recorded and prayed for a hitch free discussion to be able to develop sustainable strategic plans and outline pathways for its growth.

Welcoming the Vice Chancellor, ABU, the Deputy Director, Training, Professor Sanusi Gaya Mohammed, said "We are honored by your visit. This indeed, underscores the strong relationship between Bayero University and Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria."

The meeting started with an overview of the new MSc and PhD programmes and key management strategies; Quality assurance and accreditation as well as administrative and logistic arrangements in day one. The second day of the retreat dissolved to a breakout sessions in which it extensively discussed the RAIHub, including funding and support mechanisms, formulating action plans and timelines, as well as resource allocation and management.

These issues include uninsurable future, local, network driven resilience and autonomous and AI-enabled weaponization systems.



The final day of the retreat, discussed extensively on the CDA's detailed sustainability plan, primarily focussing on the centre's company, L'Excellence that will manage the centre's investment. The proposed communication strategy was also exhaustively discussed, challenges highlighted and the strategy was reviewed.

At the closing ceremony, the Director of the CDA, Prof Jibrin M. Jibrin thanked all the participants for their immense contributions for its success. He admitted that the exercise went beyond expectation as the commitment and dedication of members were quite commendable.

The workshop ended with proffering key recommendations on how to achieve a sustainable positive future for the centre.

Faculty of Clinical Sciences Conducts Manuscripts Writing Workshop for PG Students and Mid-Career Academics

The Faculty of Clinical Sciences at the College of Health Sciences conducted a Manuscripts Writing Workshop for Postgraduate Students and Mid-Career Academics.

The workshop was conceived as part of the faculty's unwavering commitment to staff development, recognizing the critical need to guide junior faculty in publishing high-quality research. This initiative underscored the faculty's dedication to fostering academic excellence and professional growth among its members.

It also aimed at equipping junior academics with the necessary tools and knowledge, with a view to enhancing



the overall research output and upholds the institution's reputation for scientific rigor and innovation.

In her opening remarks, the Deputy Director of ACEPHAP, Dr Taiwo Amole, highlighted the crucial role of research in the academic and professional development of lecturers, students, and professionals.

The first facilitators at the workshop and one of the senior Medical Microbiologists at the University, Prof Azeez Akande, gave a foundational lecture on the basic outline of a potentially acceptable manuscript. He also provided a guide to the participants on how to identify the predatory journals.

The presentation made by a family medicine and HIV researcher, Dr Zainab AbdulAzeez, focused on writing a compelling introduction section of a manuscript. She shares her wealth of experience with the participants on the strategies for overcoming writing challenges.

In his remarks, a Professor of Public health, Dr. Muktar A. Gadanya, described the practical strategies of presenting a concise method section of manuscripts and academic dissertations.

Similarly, the pioneer Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Prof Abdulrazaq Garba Habib, called on young researchers to adhere to high standards for scientific rigor and excellence. He emphasized the need for compliance with ethics in research and publications.

Participants were grouped into four for brief exercises and thereafter, four thematic research groups were formed. These include infectious diseases, maternal and child health, non-communicable diseases, and genomics.

The final talks and practical demonstration were anchored by Dr Mansur Aliyu, who focused on the use of online resources ((Equator network) and the use of reference Management Software, such as Endnote and Zotero.

The one-day workshop took place on Wednesday, 3rd July 2024 at the conference hall of the African Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP).

BUK Kicks-off Exam Free Professional Courses


