## ... Promises to Partner ACEPHAP to Fight the Menace By Bala G. Abdullahi

he Kano State Commissioner of Health, Dr. Abubakar Labaran Yusuf, has assured that the State Government would continue to partner with the Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) in the fight against the prevalence of maternal and child mortality in the state.

The Commissioner was speaking at a one-day sensitization workshop on the Dissemination of AFABEM Quality of Care Research findings and Introduction of the Global Health Workforce Project to the State Ministry of Health Technical Working Group on Thursday, 13th June, 2024 at Bristol Hotel, Kano.

The workshop was organized by the Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) in collaboration with Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynecology (RCOG), Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics of Nigeria (SOGON) and Johns Hopkins Programme for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics (JHPIEGO).

Dr. Yusuf observed with sadness the rising statistics of maternal and child mortality in the state, but expressed happiness by the positive role being played by ACEPHAP in the fight against the menace not only in the State, but

also globally and assured that the State Government through the Ministry of Health would work with the center to achieve the desired objectives.

He said the research findings on the Global Health Workforce project being presented today "are the issues we in the Ministry would like to hear." "It is when you know the problems that you will take informed decisions. I commend the work of ACEPHAP. I believe that together we shall salvage the health sector for the benefit of humanity," he assured.

The Commissioner wished the technical working group a successful assessment and hoped that it would come up with a workable solution that would be beneficial to all.

Presenting the Global Health Workforce Project findings, the Director of ACEPHAP, Professor Hadiza Galadanci, who is also the research's Principal Investigator, said the project was all about increasing Nigerian Health workforce capacity to deliver improved high-quality gynecological care to women and girls. She also explained that the Global Health Workforce Project was funded by UK Department of Health and Social Sciences (DHSS) with the aim to foster a more robust sustainable healthcare workforce for the future and of advancing progress towards Universal Health Care (UHC).

On the goal of the project, Prof. Galadanci disclosed that it was aimed at widening women's access to high-quality gynecological healthcare, reducing gender inequality in Nigeria and enabling women to fulfil their human rights to health and wellbeing.





Giving the justification of the project, the ACEPHAP Director stated that globally gynecological health was one of the least prioritized areas of health. She said in low and middle-income countries overall, morbidity due to benign gynecological conditions outweighed the combined morbidity from malaria, Tuberculosis (TB) and HIV/AIDS, adding that pregnancy loss was a major burden.

She said a third of the gynae cases are infertility/subfertility. She mentioned cervical cancer as the second most common cancer among women globally, with around 90 % of new cases and deaths worldwide in 2020 occurring in LMICs and that worldwide, 25 million unsafe abortions took place every year.

The project trained health providers at primary and secondary health facilities in essential gynecological skills. Facilities in Abuja used for the training are at Maitama District Hospital and Wuse District Hospital. Those facilities used for the Kano training were Sir Muhammad Sunusi General Hospital and Gwagwarwa Primary Health Care.

She further stated that the project sought to develop a team of Nigerian Expert Trainers to teach and provide mentorship, identify and support local health "champions" to prioritize gynecological services and improve access for marginalized groups as well as to work closely with Federal and State Ministries of Health to embed the training and achieve sustainable improvements to the quality of gynecological services.

On how the outcome of the research project would contribute to national/state priorities, Professor Galadanci said the project would align with Federal/State Government's commitment to. achieve Universal Health Care, support in-service professional development, capacity strengthening and the retention of Nigerian health workforce through the provision of high-quality training and mentorship and also contribute to health workforce leadership and management through SOGON clinical leadership.

In conclusion, Professor Galadanci assured the Commissioner that ACEPHAP and stakeholders would partner with the Kano State Ministry of Health and its parastatals to achieve the goal of the project, which was to foster a more robust sustainable health workforce for Kano.

The ACEPHAP Deputy Director, Research, Dr. Taiwo Amole, who presented the findings of the Dissemination of AFABEM Quality of Care project, said the assessment of quality of care involved assessing the quality of structure, quality of process and quality of outcome.

She said the World Health Organization (WHO) defined Quality of Care as one which was safe, effective, peoplecentered, timely, efficient, equitable and integrated. She disclosed that Nigeria was among the eleven countries of the Quality-of-care network, which was a network for improving the quality of care for maternal, newborn and child health, adding that it was a partnership of committed governments, implementation partners and funding agencies working to ensure that every pregnant woman, newborn and the child received good quality care with amity and dignity.

Speaking on the objective of the study, Dr. Amole said it was aimed to describe the status of RMNCH Quality of Care in health facilities in two states – Kano and Sokoto. It

was also to assess the barriers to effective governance and implementation of RMNCH Quality of Care in the four states of Kano, Sokoto, Borno and Yobe.

On the barriers to quality of care, Dr. Amole mentioned poor engagement of key stakeholders in Quality of Care activities, funding constraints, human resource shortages and deficient skills in key MCH areas. Others are lack of effective communication, gaps in implementation (e.g. Protocols for RMNCH) and over-dependence on partners (sustainability).

In conclusion, she said there was the need to know that Quality of Care was being implemented in the State. It sought to strengthen healthcare financing through innovative models like community health financing, which could promote sustainability and local ownership. It would address workforce shortages through enhanced training, recruitment incentives and leveraging technology, such as telemedicine. It would also expand healthcare access and efficiency, especially in areas with security challenges.

The AFABEM research is a project funded by a grant from USAID as part of a Global Leadership quality of care project led by Johns Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics (JHPIEGO) Nigeria.
