

BUK to Strengthen Partnership with Imperial College, NRI, University of York in UK

n a significant move to foster international collaborations and enhance research capabilities, a team from the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), led by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, recently embarked on partnership visits to some leading UK universities.

The visits aimed to strengthen the existing partnerships and explore avenues for joint teaching and supervision, staff and student exchange, cutting-edge research, and establishing long-term partnerships that would benefit both institutions.

Other members of the team were the Director of CDA, Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin, the Deputy Director (Training), Prof. S. G. Mohammed, the Deputy Director (Outreach and Publications), Prof. A. Mustapha, and the Dean of the Faculty of Earth and Environmental Science, Prof. A. S. Barau.

The visit started with the Natural Resources Institute (NRI) at the University of Greenwich, which has been a long-standing partner of the CDA. In 2017, NRI academics conducted the first international gap assessment of the CDA programmes and curricula prior to a review in 2018. This eventually led to international accreditation for the CDA programmes. Academics from BUK and NRI have collaborated in grant seeking and research.

Recently, NRI has been hosting and cosupervising CDA's PASET PhD students in a sandwich programme, while CDA is hosting NRI's postdoctoral fellows. Professor Ben Bennet and other staff of the institute welcomed the BUK team. Discussions were centered on strengthening the partnership to explore other areas, including online teaching, collaborative research, and opportunities for student and faculty exchange programs. The BUK team was taken on a tour of the Food Science and Nutrition Laboratory at the institute.

At the University of York, the team was received by Elisha Witcomb (Global Partnership Manager) and Prof Lindsay Stranger, who serves as a member of the CDA Scientific Board, cosupervisor of some postgraduate students and a partner in several CDA's research projects.

Presentations were made by Professor Jane Hill (Deputy ranked 2nd in the world and 1st in Europe by the QS World Head of Department and Chair of Research Committee, Biology), Professor Johan Kuyienstierna (Stokholm Environmental Institute), Professor Rob Merchant (York Environmental Sustainability Institute) and Professor Ian Graham (Centre for Novel Agriculture Products). Discussions after the presentation were productive, focusing on the need for interdisciplinary research, air quality and emission inventory. An important outcome of this visit was the agreement on the need to be more deliberate in proposal writing and embed funding for online teaching component in proposals.

Another area of interest is for collaboration on capacity building on the use of Low Emissions Analysis Platform (LEAP) of the Stockholm Environment Institute.

The third institution visited was the Imperial College situated in the heart of London. The university, renowned for its excellence in science, engineering, and medicine, is

University Rankings. The BUK team was received by Prof. Richard Craster, the Dean of the Faculty of Natural Sciences and other colleagues including Dr Martin Dallimar, who is a research partner of the CDA, formerly at the University of Leeds and now a staff of Imperial College.

There were presentations from the Centre for Environmental Policy and CABI. Both institutions agreed on the importance of fostering innovation through joint research projects, online teaching and student exchange. During the visit, opportunityies to respond to a call on a grant for student exchange and project accelerator fund for a joint workshop at the Imperial College were identified. The visit concluded with a working lunch where the Vice Chancellor emphasized the importance of global partnerships in enhancing the visibility of Bayero University Kano.

Council Applauds Professor Hadiza Galadanci's Research Breakthrough ... Urges other Researchers to Emulate

Members of the University Governing Council have Earlier, the Director of ACEPHAP, Professor Hadiza commended the rare research breakthrough in maternal mortality and morbidity in child delivery conducted by the Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) under Professor Hadiza Galadanci, which led to the global change of policy by the World Health Organisation (WHO).

The Chairman of the Council, His Excellency, Alhaji Nasiru Yusuf Gawuna, who led other members on a tour of the University's Centre and other facilities on Friday, 23rd August, 2024, in particular singled out Professor Hadiza Shehu Galadanci for "making Africa in general, Nigeria in particular and specifically Kano State proud by her research discovery which has now become a global

policy."

He spoke when he visited the Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP), in which Hadiza was the Director of the centre. He noted that what she did has made the entire continent of Africa and the black race all over the world proud and elated.

"Even before our appointment as members of the Council, we had heard of this wonderful project by your team on e-Motive which touches the lives of many people especially in the developing countries. We are indeed excited for this breakthrough and we are whole heartedly associated with you for this unique programme," he declared.

Alhaji Gawuna, while applauding the commitment of Galadanci in the aspect of addressing the lingering problems associated with women in child delivery, assured of the Council's desire to support all the centres in the university with a view to achieving more milestones.

Shehu Galadanci, while briefing the Council and Management, disclosed that the centre, established about a decade ago, has attracted international students from across African countries including Ghana, Kenya, Gambia, Burkina Faso, Niger Republic and Cameroon among others.

She also revealed that so far the centre had trained over 2000 people across Africa while a great number of internal staff of the University both academic and non-teaching were sponsored by the centre to attend various trainings, conferences and workshops within and outside the country for capacity building thereby impacting positively on the development of the University.

On the area of research, the Director disclosed that through the grants it has received, the centre was able to conduct a number of researches which had so far published about 300 publications in high impact journals.

Professor Galadanci in particular said the most cheering of all the researches conducted was the e-Motive undertaken by her team which had surprisingly and swiftly adopted by the World Health Organization (WHO) as a global policy now.

"Ordinarily a research takes a minimum of between 10 and 20 years before it is being adopted as a policy by the World Health Organization, but the e-Motive finding was adopted within just six months of its presentation. This is to show how impactful our research to improving the global health care delivery is," she revealed.

According to her the successes recorded were not possible but for the support and assistance it has been receiving from the Management of the University.

Earlier, the team members were at the College of Health Sciences, in which they were received by the Provost of the College, Professor A'isha Kuliya Gwarzo. She disclosed that since the commencement of MBBS Programme, it graduated about 22 sets in addition to another 26 sets of Physiotherapy graduands.

The Provost equally disclosed that recently the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria had increased the admission quota of the University for the MBBS programme from 150 to 180 per session. Although she said in view of the large number of applicants the 180 quota is grossly inadequate and therefore requesting for additional slots.

Other areas need attention in the College are the accommodation for rural posting for clinical students, provision of Multi-Purpose Laboratory, simulation centre

and a large lecture hall among others.

Responding, the Chairman of the Council, Alhaji Nasiru Other centres visited included the Centre for Infectious Yusuf Gawuna promised to wade in to the matter with a view to finding solutions to all the myriads of problem

facing the College.

He added that the AMR Club is looking forward to extending its membership to many students on Campus and the neighboring communities and assured the possibility since the club is a multidisciplinary one which could be joined by anybody from any department in the university.

After the launch, presentations were made. Dr Aisha Muhammad, Deputy Dean Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, who is also the matron of the club made a presentation tagged "Bridging the Gap: Academia, Clinical Practice and Industrial Collaboration in the Fight against Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR said that antimicrobial resistance is when Microorganisms like bacteria, vira, fungi and parasites evolve to resist the treatment of antimicrobial and stated that World Health Organization (WHO) has estimated that AMR is responsible for 1.27 millions of global deaths in 2019 and it is projected to reach 10 million deaths per year by 2050 if it is not addressed.

She added that the Nigeria Center for Disease Control (NCDC) has announced that 263,400 deaths were caused by AMR in Nigeria in 2019 and the number of AMR's deaths in Nigeria is greater than other caused by some non communicable diseases like respiratory infections, tuberculosis, cardiovascular diseases among others.

Dr Muhammad further explained the causes and effects of AMR and highlighted the roles in combating it through research and development, mechanism studies and education, noting that the industry needs to help in fighting against AMR through diagnostic tools, therapeutics and active collaboration.

The interactive session featured impactful contributions from Dean Students Affairs, Prof Shamsudeen Umar, Dean Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Prof. Ibrahim Adamu Yakasai, Faculty Officer Pharmaceutical Sciences, Bilkisu Mohammad Yusuf all from Bayero University, Kano.
