



BUK's Registration Fee Remains Unchanged, Says VC ...As Senate Approves Academic Calendar, Registration Guidelines for 2023/2024 Session

The management of Bayero University, Kano has said the students' central registration fees have remained unchanged despite the growing inflation in the country, the Vice Chancellor Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has disclosed.

Speaking during a parley with the executives members of the Students Union Government on Thursday 23rd May, 2024 in his office, Prof Abbas said the University management is conscious of the prevailing hard economic situation in the country and therefore will not add more burden on the parents and the students.

"We decided not to increase our registration fees above what we charged last academic session and we have no plan for any increment at least for now. This is because we also feel your pains and the welfare of our students is paramount," said the Vice Chancellor.

According to Professor Abbas, "Conscious of the prevailing economic situation in the country and taking into consideration of the caliber of the bulk of the students of the University, all the charges for central registration fees will remained unchanged as obtained during the 2022/2023 session."

In addition, he said the university management, as it has done last year would go round to contact other wealthy and public spirited individuals across the country to mobilize funds to support the university's indigent scholarship

scheme.

Professor Abbas while expressing the commitment of the university towards improving the welfare of staff and students noted that the burden of funding education is not for government alone, as all hands must be on deck to rescue the situation.

"As we strive hard to provide quality education, we must all come together and give a helping hand. Those who have the resources can bring in money, those vested with managing it should fear Allah and utilize it judiciously while the students and staff should handle all facilities with care, not to damage or destroy them deliberately. It is a collective responsibility and everybody is a stakeholder in this respect," he admonished.

The Vice Chancellor also charged the students to avoid anything that will jeopardise peace in the campus, saying without peace and tranquility, nothing could be achieved.

Also speaking, the President of the Students Union Government, Comrade Naseer Ibrahim Isah (Aluta Professor) thanked the Vice Chancellor for the meeting which he said will go a long way in cementing cordiality between the students body and the management for a peaceful academic session.

He noted that as students' representatives they will do everything humanly possible to support the university to achieve its goals of providing quality education to the

students. Assuring the management that SUG are partners in progress.

Meanwhile, the Senate of the university has approved academic calendar for 2023/2024 session as well as the student's registration guidelines.

The Senate, at its 412th meeting held on Wednesday, 29th May, 2024 has approved the commencement of the 2023/2024 academic calendar with registration of fresh students commencing from Monday, 3rd June and closing on 14th July, 2024 while returning students will start their registration on Monday, 10th June to close on 14th July, 2024.

Under the new registration guidelines, it noted that all students both fresh and returning must authenticate their studentship before starting the registration process using the following link : <https://mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/ug/authentication.php>.

The Senate also approved that lectures for the first semester for the 2023/2024 academic session will start on Monday, 15th July, 2024 and will finish on Saturday, 5th October, 2024 while mid-semester break (first semester) is slated for 26th to 30th August, 2024.

According to the calendar, the first semester examinations will hold between Monday, 7th October, to 9th November, 2024. **See below 2023/2024 approved Academic Calendar.**

VC Commissions Multi-million Naira Automated Thin Sectioning Machine, Solar Project at Geology Dept

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas has commissioned the multi-million naira *Thin Sectioning Machine* at the department of Geology in the Faculty of Earth and Environmental Sciences.

The machine was recently purchased by the University as part of the efforts to strengthen the department in its research especially in the mining exploration.

Briefing the Vice Chancellor, the head, department of Geology, Dr Babangida Mohammed S. Y explained that the machine is designed for cutting and grinding of rock samples down to 30 microns to enable analysis, research and examination of mineral contents using transmitted and reflected light microscopes.

He further disclosed that the machine is useful for both solid mineral and petroleum industries.

While launching the machine, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas reaffirmed the commitment of the university management to provide cutting edge equipment for both academic and other purposes.

He charged the staff to make judicial use of the facility including commercial purposes for the extractive industries, saying that the university must diversify its means of revenue generation.

Professor Abbas also commended the initiative of the staff of the department for providing a 3.5KVA solar alternative

power source aimed at facilitating teaching and research.

The Vice Chancellor while applauding the personal commitment of the staff of the department announced a donation of Geology books from his personal library with a view to encouraging them and urged other faculties and departments to emulate them.

Other projects inspected by the Vice Chancellor included the renovated staff common room and the demarcation of staff parking lot.

The Vice Chancellor Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, on 21st May 2024 attended the 6th ECOWAS parliament which held between 20th – 25th May 2024 at Bristol Palace Kano. The Vice chancellor was part of the opening session that receives the honour of the presence of important dignitaries.

This is the 6th ECOWAS parliament inaugurated by the Chairman of the Authority of Head of States and Government of ECOWAS, President Bola Ahmad Tinubu following the end of the 5th Legislature on March, 8th 2024.

The Members of the new Bureau as elected include first Deputy Speaker, Rt. Hon Barau Jibril who is expected to serve as Acting Speaker of the Sixth Legislature pending the election of substantive Speaker of the Parliament. The position of substantive speaker of the parliament was allocated to Republic of Togo.

The acting Speaker of the Parliament, Rt. Hon. Senator Barau I. Jibril urged members to maintain the spirit of brotherhood that will facilitate to nurture the development of West African region. “We are all brothers and sisters we were only divided by those who colonised us. I am delighted today for having the whole of West African region in Kano which is the beacon of Northern Nigeria and Hub for commercial activities”.

One of the legislators that attended spoke on the issue of women that are not involved in decision making positions. Hon Hajiya Ladi from Ghana raised the issue of women involvement in key decision making position. She emphasised that if care is not taken one day you will not find a single lady in key positions in West Africa. She

added that this parliament should encourage the parliament of going to different countries and cities for this session so as to experience their culture. “I grew up in Ghana hearing stories and sang songs of the history of Kano. I was enthusiastic about going round the city to see the things that we use to think are myth”.

The Parliament agreed upon establishing and reactivation of committee with the mandate of negotiation on the crisis of the region of Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger republic respectively.

The newly elected Bureau of the sixth legislature is expected to govern over the affairs of Parliament for four-year in line with Article 5 of the Supplementary Act relating to the Enactment of the powers of the parliament.

Seven senior academics from Bayero University, Kano have been appointed into the newly reconstituted TETFund National Research Fund Screening and Monitoring Committee (NRFS&MC).

The 55-member committee under the chairmanship of Professor Hayward Babale Mafuyai from University of Jos as Chairman has former Vice Chancellor of Bayero University and that of Federal University, Dutse, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello and Fatima Batul Muktar as members respectively.

A letter of appointment signed by the Executive Secretary of Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) Arc. Sonny S.T Echono said the Minister of Education approved the reconstitution of the membership of the committee.

Other BUK academics who made into the committee are; Professor Badayi M. Sani, Professor Aminu Zakari Mohammed, Professor Aishatu Abubakar Halliru and Professor Sa'idu Adamu Ibrahim as well as Professor

Tanimu Abubakar.

The committee will be communicated on the date and venue for inauguration in due course.

The Vice Chancellor Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas while congratulating the appointees said the honour is not only for themselves but recognition of the University as a whole and urged them to justify the confidence reposed in them.

REGISTRATION GUIDELINES FOR 2023/2024 ACADEMIC SESSION

A. Authentication

All students whether fresh or returning need to authenticate their studentship before starting the registration process via <https://mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/ug/authentication.php>

- **Fresh Students;** Screening and Registration runs from 3rd June to 14th July, 2024.
- **Requirement for authentication:**
 1. Serial number of Admission Letter
 2. Jamb Number
 3. University Registration Number

Note that Username and Password will be generated automatically at the point of authentication. After successful authentication, candidates are expected to keep their Username and Password safe and confidential.

- **Returning Students;** Registration is from 10th June to 14th July, 2024.
- **Requirement for authentication:**
 1. Registration Number
 2. Last Session's Username
 3. Jamb Number

Note that password will be generated automatically after authentication. All passwords must be kept safe and confidential.

For those that have forgotten their usernames, Password Retrieval Page is provided where students are expected to enter their Registration number and Jamb number. The engine will automatically generate the Username and Password.

B. Login

After successful authentication, students can use their respective username and password to login in order to start or continue with the registration process.

C. Registration Procedure

The registration procedure is as follows:

1. **Profile Update:** Students must first update their profile. Note that students are strongly advised to update their phone numbers and emails used on their BUK Personalized Payment Form (BUKPPF).
2. **Student Information Form (S.I.F.):** After profile update, students can generate, download and print their Student Information Form (SIF).
3. **BUK Personalised Payment Form (BUKPPF):** Students must generate, download and print a BUK Personalised Payment Form (BUKPPF). Registration fees are reflected on student's BUKPPF, to be paid using Remita e-Payments and e-Collection platform (visit <https://mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/ug/paymentprocedure.php> the payment procedure). **Make sure you carefully read, understand and follow the payment procedure, as BUK will not be liable for any lost of funds as a result of incorrect data entry.** Students must make sure that they enter ALL the information of the BUKPPF ACCURATELY.

Note that in the event a student is not the one making the payment (payment by proxy) make sure to use the student information (Full name, Email & Phone number). Any misinformation may lead to unnecessary delay in validating and processing of payment. Payments are usually validated and processed within 24/48 hours.

ALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE AFTER PAYMENT

4. **Student Payment Receipt (S.P.R.):** After payment is validated and processed, students must generate, download and print Student Payment Receipt (SPR) in order to continue with the registration.
5. **Course Registration:** After printing the SPR, a student can register his/her courses. Students are strongly advised to seek the guidance of their respective Level Coordinators on the courses they are supposed to register.

NOTE: A student cannot earn a credit in any course he/she has not duly registered for through the normal registration process, or the Add/Drop process. Thus, if a student sits for an examination for any course for which he did not register, the result of such an examination shall be cancelled in accordance with Section 4.23 of the General Examinations and Academic Regulations (GEAR).

6. **Course Registration Form (C.R.F.):** After course registration, students must generate, download and print the Course Registration Form (CRF). The CRF contains the details of the registered courses for onward submission to the Level Coordinator.
7. **Registration Acknowledgement Slip (R.A.S.):** After printing the CRF, students can print the Registration Acknowledgement Slip (RAS) to acknowledge that they have successfully completed the registration process.

Students can logout and continue the registration at a later time.
