Introduction

Trade unions have been indispensable and critical stakeholders in Nigerian public universities since 1970s. The history of Nigerian university system is replete with struggles by the university-based trade unions. These struggles were, and still are, geared towards achieving improved working conditions, increased funding for the universities, protecting members' rights, fostering academic freedom and university autonomy, democratizing the university system, checking the excesses of authoritarian university administrators, resisting attempts to commercialise university education, among others. Undisputably, quite a number of concessions have been won in the decades-long struggles waged in the face of harassment, intimidation, threats, dismissals, arrests and illegal detention of union leaders by the Nigerian governments and university administrators.

This book project intends to celebrate an indefatigable unionist, Comrade Abdullahi Sule-Kano. Undoubtedly, the history of labour relations and successes of university-based trade union struggles enumerated in the preceding paragraph bear the stamp of his contributions. Comrade Sule-Kano has diligently served the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) at different times and capacities. He was a one-time Branch Chairperson, ASUU Usmanu Danfodiyo University (1992 - 1995); Member, FGN/ASUU Renegotiation Committee (2006 - 2009 and 2017 to date); Vice President of ASUU (2001 - 2004); President of ASUU (2004 - 2008); and currently a Trustee (2015 - date).

The history and evolution of labour relations in Nigerian public universities and the contributions, sacrifices, steadfastness and selflessness of the committed leaders of trade unions are worth culogizing and documenting in volumes such as this for posterity and for the purpose of inspiring young activists. This book project, themed Trade Unions and Labour Relations in Nigerian Public Universities: Book in Honour of Comrade Abdullahi Sule-Kano, is set to achieve this objective.

- Labour disputes resolution mechanisms in public universities.

- Social protection, job security and job satisfaction.

NOTIFICATION ON THE NECESSITY TO URGENTLY PROMOTE THE OFFICIAL VERSION OF THE NEW NATIONAL ANTHEM AS SIGNED INTO LAW BY THE PRESIDENT

It has become expedient for the National Orientation Agency to circulate the official version of the New National Anthem which will clear all doubts about the correct lyrics as contained in the Act signed by the President, His Excellency, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu GCFR.

Recall that the National Anthem is part of the National Identity Project (NIP) of this administration, being one of the seven programmes for the installation of our national values. It is also one of the country's National Symbols, which the NOA as custodian is mandated to promote and preserve its integrity for National cohesior unity and a sense of patriolism.

We write to also notify you that NOA will call for entries for the production of an authentic Nigerian Melody, facing into cognsance, the indigenous instrumentation of the Nigerian people. The effective data for the entries and the procedure will be announced through NOA channels in the coming week and please note that the National Pledge remain valid and operational.

We want to particularly draw attention to some aspects of the current National Anthem that are being wrongly rendered.

Line three (3) at the first stanna, which reads, "Though tribes and tongues may differ". Note that the words tribes and tongues are in plural, we want you to also note that line five (5) of the first stanna reads "Nigerians all are proud to serve. The word are not and is correct.

Nigeria, we hail thee,
Our own dear native land,
Though tribe and tongue may differ,
in brotherhood we stand,
Nigerians all, and proud to serve
Our sovereign Motherland

Our flag shall be a symbol That truth and justice reign, In peace or battle honour'd, And this we count as gain, To hand on to our children a banner without stain.

O God of all creation,
Grant this our one request,
Help us to build a nation
Where no man is oppressed,
And so with peace and plenty
Nigeria may be blessed.
