

IPPIS Removal: Government not Withdrawing University Funding ...Says Education Minister

Removing tertiary institutions from the Integrated Payroll and Personnel Information System (IPPIS), was done in good faith and will not in any way affect government's commitment towards funding the institutions, the Minister of Education, Professor Tahir Mamman, has assured.

“Removing Universities from IPPIS payroll will not affect government's funding of the tertiary institutions. It was just part of efforts to allow them administrative autonomy,” said the Minister.

The Minister, who spoke exclusively to BUK Bulletin at Malam Aminu Kano International Airport, Kano on Sunday, 28th January, 2024, explained that, government was very much committed to improving the funding of universities.

The minister assured universities and other tertiary institutions to feel comfortable and relax, saying that the federal government “for now has no intention to withdraw its funding.”

According to him, the administration of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu is desirous of making universities to play their roles in national development. I am sure his fresh ideas will propel development.

Professor Mamman disclosed that the idea was part of the deliberate policy to grant administrative autonomy similar to that of academic granted some years ago with a view to actualizing their full autonomy for improve services.

He assured that government will find more ways of funding the education sector, because without education there would be no development. “No matter what, government will not withdraw from subsidizing the education sector,” he assured.

On Students Loan Scheme, the minister disclosed that all machineries have been put in place for the take up of the programme. He noted that government was very much committed to the loan scheme, it has sourced out funding for the outfit.

He added that environmental sustainability was firmly embedded in Islam as Qur'anic verses and Prophet Muhammad's (SAW) traditions (Hadiths) talked about environmental cleanliness and protection.

The former NUC boss explained that from Islamic perspectives, God created a balanced world which must be preserved and protected by man through justice, adding that people must be environmentally conscious.

The keynote speaker, Mr Kamran Shezad in a paper titled: *Qur'an, Sunnah and Climate Crisis: From Theology to Action*, stated that it would not be a business as usual as people must change the way they do things as the world is undergoing an environmental crisis.

While citing several Qur'anic and Hadith injunctions on the need to preserve the environment and personal hygiene, Mr Shezad advocated the need for greening the mosques and houses as part of Islamic faith.

Mr Kamran, who is Director, Islamic Foundation for Ecology and Environmental Society, Birmingham University, UK, said in recent times, there have been significant effort in Islamic world to change the narrative citing the example of Al-mizan that strengthens international, national and local actions that combat climate change and the threats to the planet.

Other initiatives to combat environmental challenges are Bahu Trust Masjid in UK, Madarassa syllabus, an Islamic inspired climate guides, Eco Conscious Guide to Ramadhan and Birmingham Qur'an academy.

Presenting the second keynote address, Professor Omar Hasan Kasule, said change in the behavior can significantly impact the environment, adding that the focus should first be on individual rather than the whole society.

Prof Kasule, who is the Chairman Research Ethics Review Board, King Abdallah Bin Abdulaziz University Hospital, Riyadh, noted that the attention of the world has been shifted to acquiring sophisticated machines without corresponding balance of environmental preservations.

He stated that environmental crisis has been on for centuries and that people should turn to Quran to find the solutions to environmental challenges.

Goodwill messages were presented by the Honourable Commissioner of Environment, Kano State, Honourable Nasiru Garo and Branch Manager, TAJ Bank, Kano, Aliyu Bakari.

Highlight of the opening session was a commentary of a film called Sacred Island by Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu, which was showed at the conference.

Indorama Eleme Fertilizer, ETG Agro Company Give Scholarship Awards to Students from Faculty of Agric



The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has commended the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) for setting the pace for teaching and research in the University.

Professor Abbas, who spoke at the opening ceremony of the workshop of Curriculum Review of Postgraduate Programmes of the Center held on Wednesday, 7th February, 2024.

He stated that the curriculum review was organized in response to the evolving global landscape, compounded by the challenges posed by the recent pandemic, which have adversely impacted on higher education delivery.

“I initiated a committee to review the curricula and mode of delivery of the CDA programmes. This initiative is part of the University's commitment to ensuring improved visibility, wider coverage and seamless dissemination of knowledge as well as the sustainability of the Centre and its activities,” the Vice Chancellor said.

According to him with the expertise of committee members drawn from various academic units of the university, including the Deans of the School of Postgraduate Studies and the Faculty of Education; Directors of Academic Planning, Centre for Information Technology, Centre for Renewable Energy and Sustainable Transition, Laboratory Management Services, Gender Studies, and the Directorate of Research, Innovation, and Partnership, he is optimistic that this

committee has charted a new pathway for the Centre's future and by extension a road map for the wider university community to follow.

The Vice Chancellor said it was crucial to reflect on the Centre's journey, particularly its achievements in fulfilling its mission and vision. He noted that Significant milestones include the review and validation of the curriculum in January 2018 and the international accreditation received from the High Council for Evaluation of Research and Higher Education (HCRES) in France in September 2019, an accolade valid for five years.

"The university will leverage on the existence of our Centre for Competence in Digital Education (C-CoDE) and other critical infrastructure to support these new programmes, as we navigate to new mode of delivery," the VC said.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Director CDA, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin expressed confidence that with the high caliber of competent personalities involved, significant achievement would be recorded in the review of the curriculum of PG programmes of the Centre.

Present Additional Qualification within Reasonable Period or Revert to Non-Teaching Cadre ...VC Tells Academic Staff *To allocate 30% of TET fund to Non-Teaching Staff Development

The Management of Bayero University Kano will not hesitate to convert any academic staff to non-teaching cadre who fails to present higher degrees after a stipulated period as contained in the condition of service in the university, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has disclosed.

The Vice Chancellor, who spoke on Wednesday 7th February 2024, during an orientation programme for the new recruited Staff, explained that the university will from now adhere strictly to the provisions of the condition of service which explicitly stated that any teaching staff recruited with a bachelors degree must present additional qualification after 3 years, failure of which would be taken back to the non-teaching cadre.

According to him the idea was to promote hard working and commitment amongst staff as well as to allow easy
